

# Old sweaters make new friends – in Guatemala

It was a simple answer to a simple challenge: yes!

Doug Fread, Rob Charette and the rest of the members of the Acton chapter of the Rotary Club answered the call from the president of the Guelph Club when he challenged all area clubs to donate sweaters to indigenous Mayan peoples living in Zacapa, a mountain-region of Guatemala.

"If you could see the video, you'd see there really is a

need. You think you worry about yourself, but these people really are poor," Charette said.

The Acton Club responded by gathering between 75-80 sweaters and seeing that they were ready for shipping and cleaning in Guelph. In the spirit of the chal-

lenge, dry cleaning and shipping have been provided free of charge.

"This was first done by the

Guelph Club," Charette said. "Last year the club built a school in Guatemala."

David Marshall, president of the Guelph chapter, took it upon himself to put the challenge out and motivate Rotarians in the area to give of themselves in an initiative outside the normal scope of Rotary International.

The sweaters were shipped to Guelph for cleaning last Wednesday.
