Halton councillors and MPP
Ted Chudleigh have added
their names to a request that
the Minister of Transportation confirm the proposed reconstruction of Trafalgar
Road from just west of Georgetown to Silvercreek.

Acton Councillor Rick Bonnette had suggested the Town try to get confirmation that the project would go ahead in light of major changes occurring at Queen's Park. Last week, Bonnette reported that both the Region and Chudleigh also want confirmation that the \$5 million highway improvements would proceed. So far, there's been no answer.

Budget delegations invited at debates

Halton taxpayers can have a say in the Halton Board of Education's proposed \$284.2 million budget – the budget that accounts for over two-thirds of the tax bill in the Region.

Trustees will continue budget debates next week and the public is invited to make delegations on March 24, 25 and 26.

This year's proposed budget, up from \$272.2 million last year, includes a \$4 million surplus from last year made up of supplementary taxes from new residential and commercial development. Without any additions or deletions, the proposed budget would cost the average resident approximately \$100 more in education taxes this year.
