Acton bowlers shine at Stardom Tournament

Acton Bowling Lanes was well represented in the recent Four Steps to Stardom tournament, played between Feb. 22 and March 2. The youth who entered the tournament competed against nine other bowling centres in the zone's area.

Bantams, juniors and seniors competed as teams or as individuals, with teams playing three games and singles playing five games.

Leading the way and advancing to provincial finals was Kylie Kruk, who earned gold in the bantam girls singles with a combined score of 937 over five games.

Ryan Stroud took third place for the bantam boys singles, bowling 897.

The bantam boys team of Kyle Fendley, Kyle Creasey, Kyle Harding, Curtis McArthur and Roberto Umbrello earned second place

honours, missing first by just 26 pins. The boys, coached by Gord Labombard, bowled a combined score of 2,218 over three games.

The bantam girls team finished the competition in seventh place, scoring a total of 1,624 points.

For the juniors, Sarah Kruk took sixth place in the girls singles with 816.

Meanwhile Daniel Newell finished in eighth place with 892 points.

The junior boys team ended up in fourth place, missing third by only seven pins with a score of 2,594. The junior girls team finished in sixth place, bowling 2,200 in their games.

Senior girl Sarah Perkins came in fourth place with her score of 886 while David Albano finished 10th in the senior boys singles division scoring 853 points.

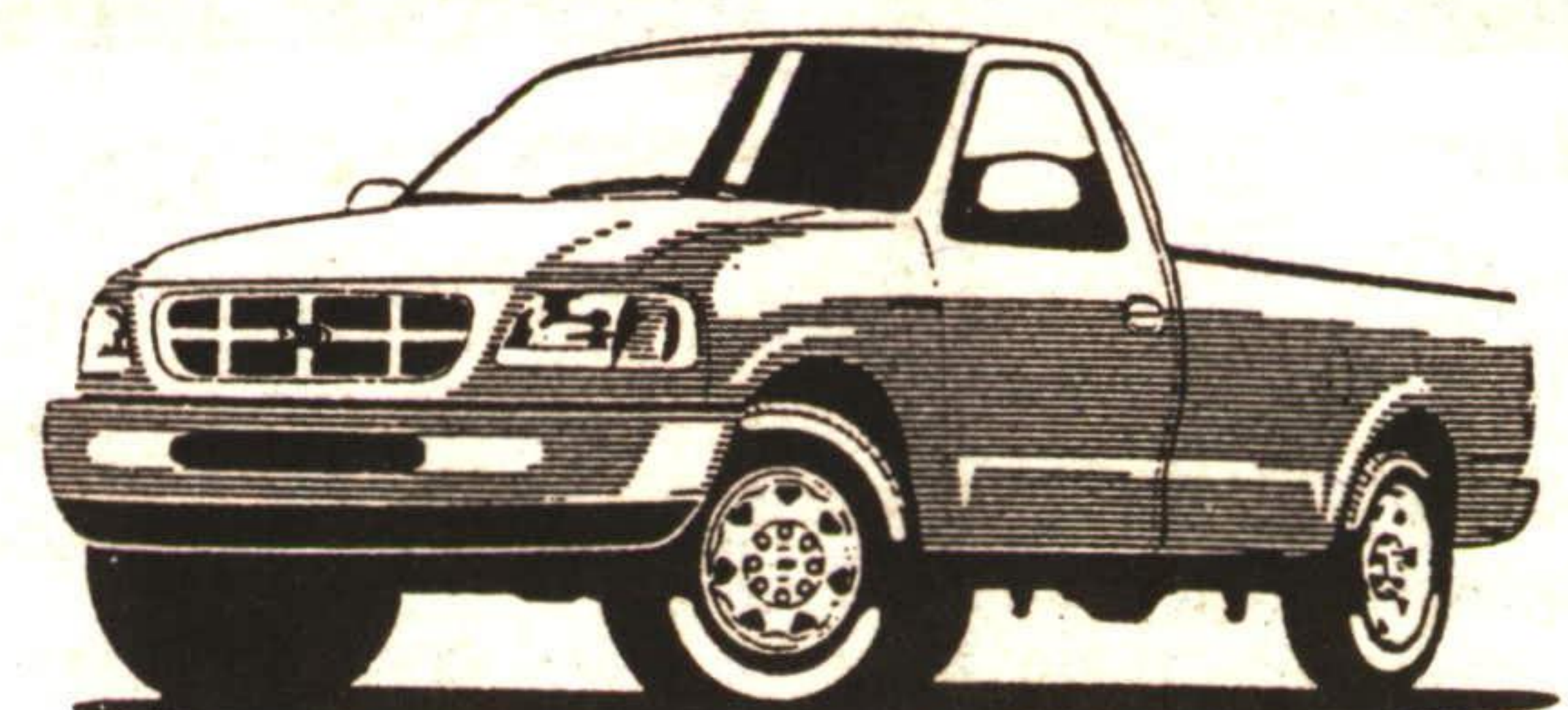
