



BIRDING BLITZ: Mountsberg Wildlife Centre hosts the 8th Annual Bushnell Birding Blitz for conservation on May 31st. public information

Enjoy the guided hikes where even beginners can spot 50 or so of the 125 species regularly observed at Mountsberg. Lots of displays and entertainment. ROAD WATCH: The Road Watch evening was very successful, and there is a great deal of interest in establishing this Public Road Watch program through the Community Consultation Committee. The goal is to improve road safety by targeting aggressive driving habits. Citizens fill out a Report Form listing the dangerous action, and police then contact the owner of the vehicle by letter or phone. If the infraction is particularly serious, charges can be laid, but generally the letter is enough - especially if a parent or employer receives it. Reporting forms will be available through Police Stations, CCC members, and possibly

Rural Watch. This program is successfully operating in other Ontario communities including Halton Hills and Caledon. Watch for more information at



This provides an avenue for the public to communicate concerns, suggestions, and comments to the Police Department and the CCC. Blue boxes are located at Foodland The Livery Campbellville, Clover Farms in Haltonville, and the Trading


Post in Brookville. FILMING: The PSI FACTOR, Chronicles of the Paranormal, spent May 14 & 15 on location filming at Dufferin Quarries. The Quarry simulated a Northern Arctic Mine quarry and will be featured in the new season opening episode titled "Jaunt" likely to air in early 1999 on Global Television. It links the current season finale, "Egress," in which an arch is discovered which teleports people to the unknown. In this case part of the arch is none other than our own Dufferin Quarry. The scenes include a

helicopter landing and simulated gunfire. Atlantis Films Limited worked closely with staff from Dufferin Aggregates, Halton Police and the Town of Milton. Dufferin regularly donates location fees to Milton District Hospital.

SUNOCO: Watch for new features at the Sunoco Station across from the Firehall on the Guelph Line. The construction, continuing through June will result in a drive-through window and walk-in counter for CoffeeTime Donuts. The new facilities will also include an information room for Tourism Information, and be open for 24-horn service.

DIAL 911: Is your phone number & home properly listed with the 911 emergency service? If you are in the 905 area, or if you have an Acton 853 exchange, you probably are okay, but there is an on-going concern with the 856 exchanges and exchanges traditionally associated with Guelph. Letters will be hand delivered to these residences with a phone number they can call to check, and properly register their civic address so that emergency response time can be minimized.
