David Henderson and his wife Mary Anderson emigrated to Canada from Ireland. The Hendersons likely knew others from Northern Ireland, the Kennedys and Knowles families. When the Hendersons travelled through the night on foot and entered Canada, David was the son of John Bell - one of the founders of the Nassagaweya Presbyterian Church. The farm was the east half of Lot 13, Con. 5 from William Smith and his married sisters Margaret and Janet Smith. David purchased Lot 21, Con. 6, Nassagaweya. David's daughter Martha died shortly after she was born. David purchased the Lot 20 farm where he lived until his death. When David passed away in 1880, son James took over the Lot 20 farm which he farmed most of his life. James sold the Lot 20 farm to his son David A. in 1899. David A. later married Sarah Bell. John Jeremiah took over the Lot 20 farm after David A. passed away. John purchased the Lot 19, Con. 6, farm (Thornton) and was heavily involved in the lumber business in Acton. John died in 1910. Mary Henderson, known as Mary, as did her sister Agnes Mae, who married Joseph Orton. James Henderson married Alexander Crawford and farmed until 1907 and had three sons: John Joseph, James and David. James farmed until selling Lot 19 and 20 in the early 1960's. He then worked for Texaco in the furnace fuel business in the Port Credit area. James graduated from Knox Theological College in 1945. He was ordained as a minister. He married Ethel Pridham, who at one time taught in Acton. Making maple syrup was a tradition for the Henderson family. James chased an evaporator and for the next 30 years produced maple syrup.

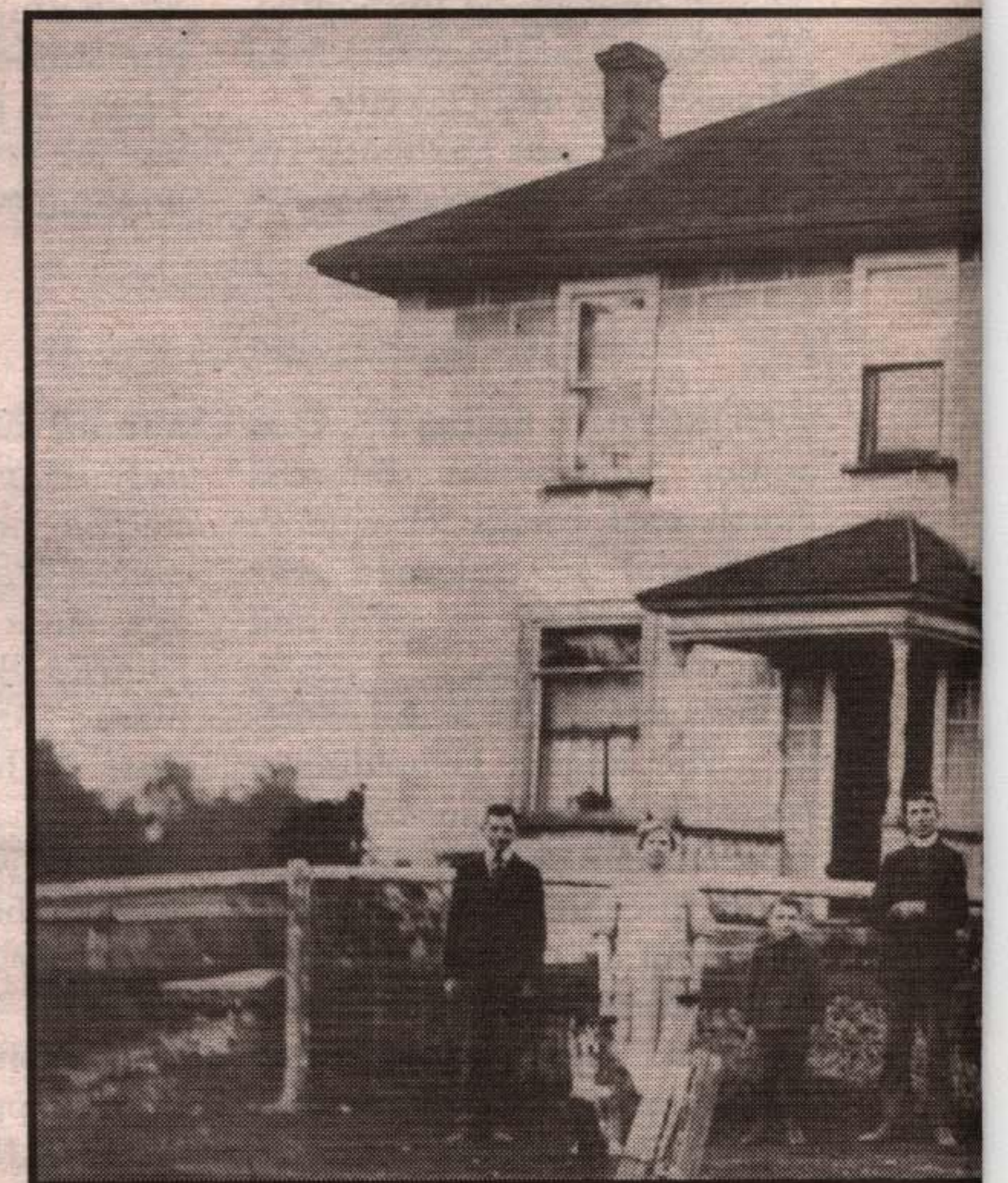
