

"Cedar is light and easy to handle," remarked Mogensen. "I use it a lot when I'm doing shows." Mogensen's business is Chain Saw Sculptures, and he travels to various events where he creates magnificent wooden figures.

Families enjoyed the butterfly garden, snake hibernaculum, a display of snakes and amphibians by Wye Marsh, and the making of Japanese fish kites. A portion of the proceeds of the barbecue sponsored by Maple Lodge Farms will go toward Willow Park rehabilitation. Local churches also entered into the spirit of things with huge garage sales.

In the Lucy Maud Montgomery Garden, visitors enjoyed trying the interactive sundial and learning more about Canada's famous author from Kathy Gastle, above, who was dressed in period costume once belonging to Mrs. Webster. Dr. Webster, the local physician for many years, took his wife to the Chicago Fair in 1892. Mrs. Webster purchased the fine cotton and lace dress there, and was on the cutting edge of fashion as this was one of the first pieces of clothing entirely made by machine.
