FAMILY SEARCH

For the last 2 years I have been involved with my family research. The Craine (Crane) family lived in and around the Halton area from at least 1850 to 1919. Thomas Craine, my Great Great Grandfather, was born on the Isle of Man in 1822 and came to Canada when still a child. He was the shoemaker in Glen Williams in 1850. He married Sarah Brown and they had 5 children. They lived in the Glen Williams, Acton, Georgetown area until the early 1900's. From this family we are related to the Tysons of Berlin, Ont., Kennedys of Acton, McGills of Tarbett (Grand Valley), the Grays of Erin, and the Masales of Erin.

My Great Grandfather, Thomas Lewis Craine married Isabelle Gray in Hillsburgh. They, along with 10 of their 14 children, went to Michigan in the early 1900's but lived generally in the Halton area until then. They lived in Mimosa, Erin (Wellington County), Egremont (Gray County), Berlin (Waterloo County), and Milton (Halton County). Lawrence (Lorne) Craine, my Great Uncle, owned the general store in Terra Cotta. It is now the Terra Cotta Inn.

My Grandfather, Charles Craine, married Margaret (Maggie) Hilson in Milton. They lived there from at least 1898 until 1919 when they moved to Guelph with their 11 children. The family remained there. Oscar Craine, my uncle, had a car garage in the Forge in Terra Cotta in 1922. Through marriages we are related to the Hilsons, Gullis, Proctors, Haywards, Appleyards, Icams, Dawsons, Jones, Forbes, Downers, and even Mr. Marshall Neilson.

I am searching for newspaper articles, photos, and any other information or memorabilia, regarding these people. I would also like to be in touch with anyone who is related to me or knows anything that may help me.
