Halton Regional Police and Ontario Fire Marshall's office determined that a large quantity of gasoline purchased by the victim prior to the fire was spread throughout the residence and subsequently ignited. Investigators concluded that Rudy Stotyn died as a result of his own deliberate actions.

# Road Safety Week

May 30th - June 6th

SPECIAL TO THE COMPASS

You may be dead wrong if you think you can't do something about the safety of our roads!

**Bicycle Safety:** You could be dead wrong letting a child under nine on the road without the company of an adult. They are unable to make choices about traffic because they haven't yet developed the perception required for distance and speed.

**Truck Safety:** Don't assume the driver can see you - you could be dead wrong! There is a twenty foot 'blind' spot behind the trailer and on both sides. If you can't see a truck driver's face in his rear view mirror - he can't see you either!

Truck Drivers - do you have enough reflectivity on your trucks to conform with regulations for newer trucks? You could be dead wrong if you don't!

**Intersection Safety:** Obey the stop signs/red lights - you may be dead wrong if you don't.

**Don't Drink & Drive:** Is the drink worth it if you end up dead? Or worse - killing someone else?

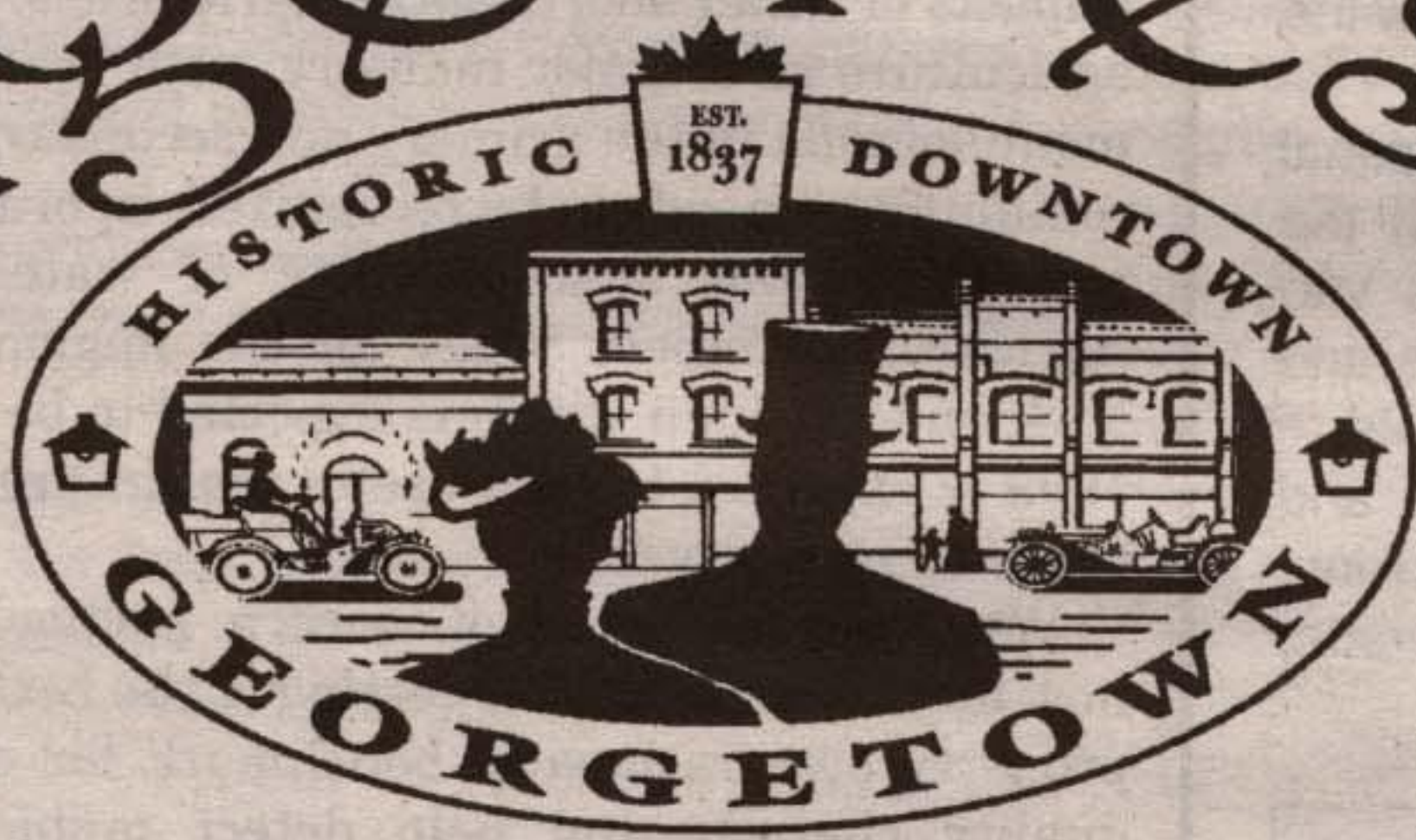
**Child Seat Safety:** You could be dead wrong if you haven't had your child's safety seat checked. Ensure everyone is buckled up properly.
