Georgetown's new field of dreams

THH announces land purchase to accommodate sports park

The Town of Halton Hills has added a major piece of the puzzle for the future of sports and recreation in Georgetown.

Halton Hills Council and staff announced on July 23rd its approval to purchase a 98 acre property adjacent to its existing Operations Yard.

Shynal, THH Brian Director of Recreation and Parks, said the property, situated at the north west corner of 17th Side Road and Trafalgar Road is "ideal to meet the expansion needs of the Yards Operation and provide a large number of playing fields."

Council will also consider if the property is feasible for a new recreational centre. Town water is available to the site from the THH Operations Yard.

Shynal said the Town had been actively seeking a site for the last two years and had looked at 262 properties before selecting the part of the East Half of Lot 18, Concession 7.

The parcel of land is currently under crop and zoned for agricultural usage. Town staff said the sale is conditional and subject to a title search and environmental assessment.

Staff anticipate finalizing

the deal in October. THH staff and Council attending the press conference refused to reveal the price of the purchase until the deal is finalized.

In reference to the ongoing search for a sports park site for Acton, Halton Hills Mayor Marilyn Serjeantson "Obviously, we would have even a larger smile today if we had a two property purchase to announce." The Mayor added, "It may have taken a long time to find the Georgetown site, but Council remains positive of finding a site in the Acton area in the near future."
