

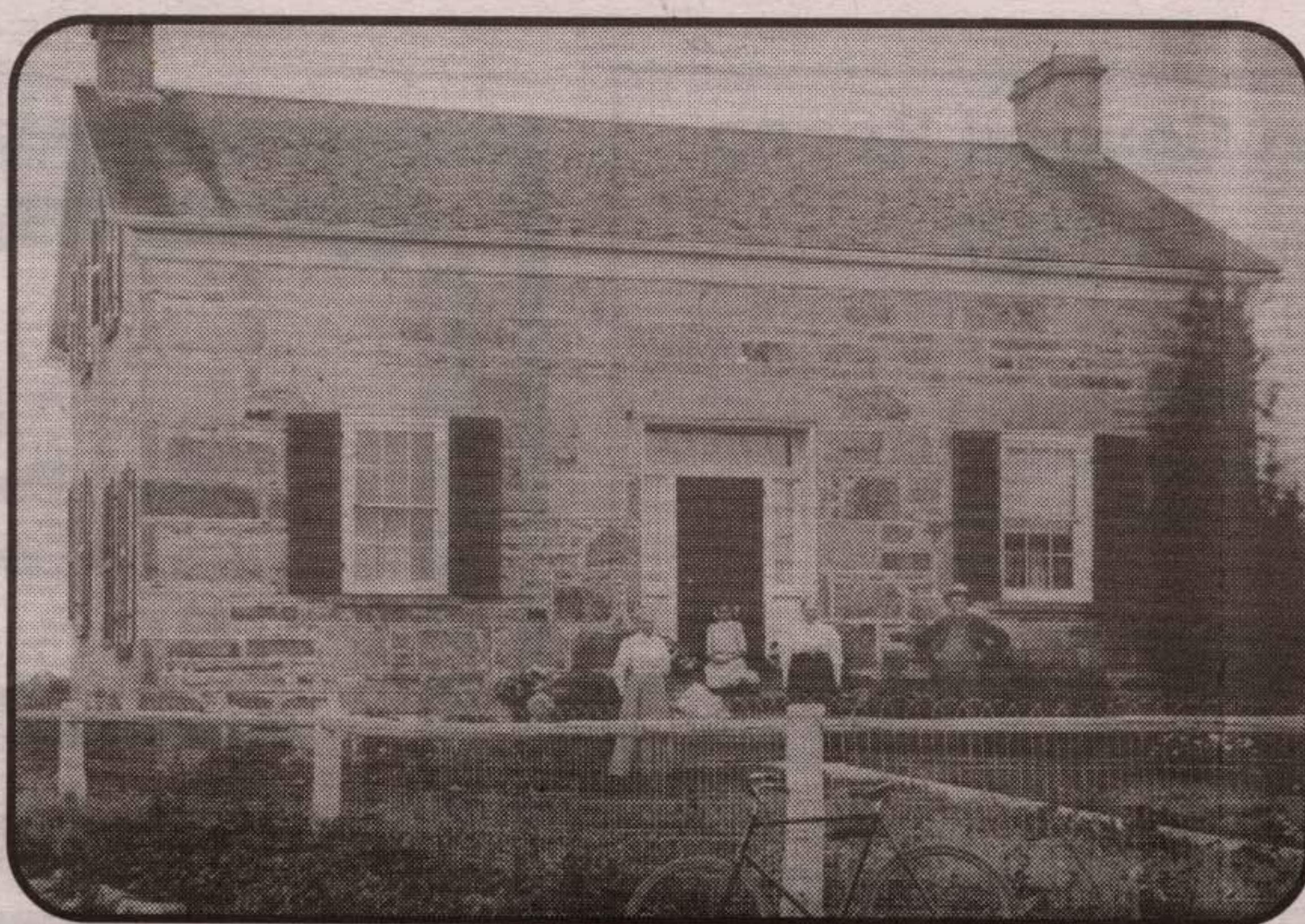

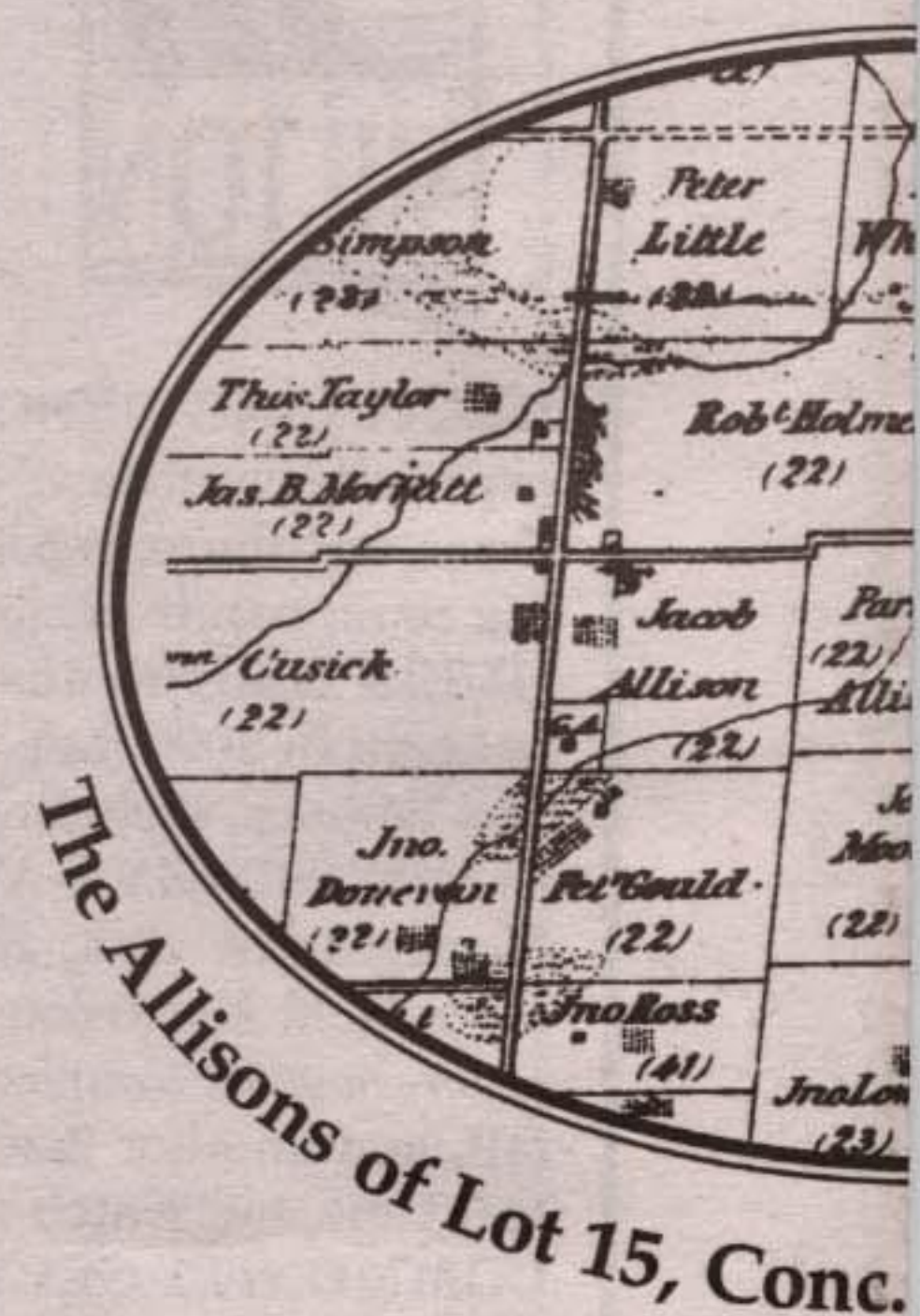

# Shoebox

John Allison

The Allison's originated from Barnard Castle, Auckland St. England and came to Canada circa 1830. There were five brothers, Thomas, and two sisters, Hannah and Rachel, with the possibility of Margaret, who may have remained in England. Joseph and Hannah in/ at Barnard Castle, England. It has been passed down that Joseph and Hannah in England approximately c. 1820. George and John came to Canada. George, the oldest son, brought his mother Hannah. George and John settled in North York and bought Lot 15, Con. 2 from the Crown. George took the west half and John took the east half is dated 1836 purchase from the Canada Company by John and Parker. They married in England and immediately came to Canada. Parker's forefathers were Earls of Scotland. John retired from farming. According to the Nassagaweya Centennial Journal 1850-1950 of Joshua Allison, John was hale and hearty. Parker, son of John, married Maria Wingrove. Parker's son, William John, J. Thomas, and Joshua Parker. Parker was one of the best gardeners. He had two boxes of cookies in the cellar way, a wing shelf with 4 or 5 rooms, and some sugar candy under the counter. Parker smoked a pipe. He suffered a great deal. Maria also died of cancer. Parker's son, John, married Nancy Jane Storey and lived on Lot 15 Con 4 when the new one was built, and moved it over near his barn, converted to a brick house was built. John ran a small grocery store and gas station for a period of time. He also took butter, eggs, poultry, vegetables and meat. Joanna. Lot 16 Con 3 was owned by Thomas Allison, also a son of John, that went around to different farms in the neighbourhood to take care of the cows, James, and Elsie. Jim remained on the property until 1958 when he sold the barn and some livestock to a fire. Joshua Parker Allison, youngest son of John, the original Allison homestead Lot 15, Con 2 W. which he farmed for a business was from his farm. Joshua carried on from his father being an extension to the post office and moved his business there where he continued farming and they all made maple syrup every year, John having the house as housekeepers. The only Allison's still owning and living on part of the original estate daughter and family built a new home on part of his remaining property, a son of Parker. Harold continued to farm both Lot 15, Con 2 E and also a mail carrier part time from the time he was 16 until he was 19. The Allison's owned quite a few farms around the area. Many of the farms were in Canada, and the United States to as far south as Arizona and Florida. The Allison's in contact through family reunions, both in the U.S. and Canada.
