Township Guelph Eramosa Council has rejected a proposal by the Eden Mills Community Club to deed sole ownership to the Club.

The proposal was made to clear the way for a Trillium Foundation grant, a grant that would be used to make the hall in Eden Mills wheelchair accessible.

Accessibility is an expensive venture. Because of the elevation of the main floor, an outdoor ramp is not feasible - it would have to be over 100 feet long, which is over twice the length of the hall. The most viable option is to put in a lift which will cost over \$30,000.

There were positive signs that a grant for almost \$28,000 from Trillium Foundation might be approved. The sticking point was that grants are only made to non-government organizations. The Eden Mills Community Hall is co-owned by the Township and the Club, as established under a

1994 Ontario Municipal Board Order, thus rendering it ineligible. Under the current arrangement, the Club covers all its own expenses through fund-raisers and rentals. For its part, Township waives property taxes on the Hall and covers some of the liability insurance.

The Club proposal would have cleared the way for the application to go forward. A condition of the deed would have been that Council would have first option to purchase the hall for \$1.00 in the case of the dissolution of the Community Club.

Mayor Dave Adsett met with the Club Executive to discuss the proposal. He subsequently solicited comments from the residents of Eden Mills and arranged for a Public Meeting on November 8th. There were ten letters of support for the proposal received by Council. There was also one letter in opposition to the proposal signed by 17 Eden Mills residents. Many of the proponents showed up to the public meeting and voiced their support for the Community Club and the accessibility project.

The proposal killer was Council's refusal to continue to waive the property taxes and assist with the insurance - an expense of \$5,000 a year. Council's lawyer indicated that the Township was bound by municipal law. The Club cannot cover this expense with their current budget and even if they could, the ongoing costs would soon outweigh the benefit of the one-time grant.

In response to the rejected proposal, Adsett indicated that the Township would include the project in next year's budget. The good news is that the hall will be made wheelchair accessible. The not-so-good news is that the taxpayers of the township will pay for this rather than the Trillium Foundation.


