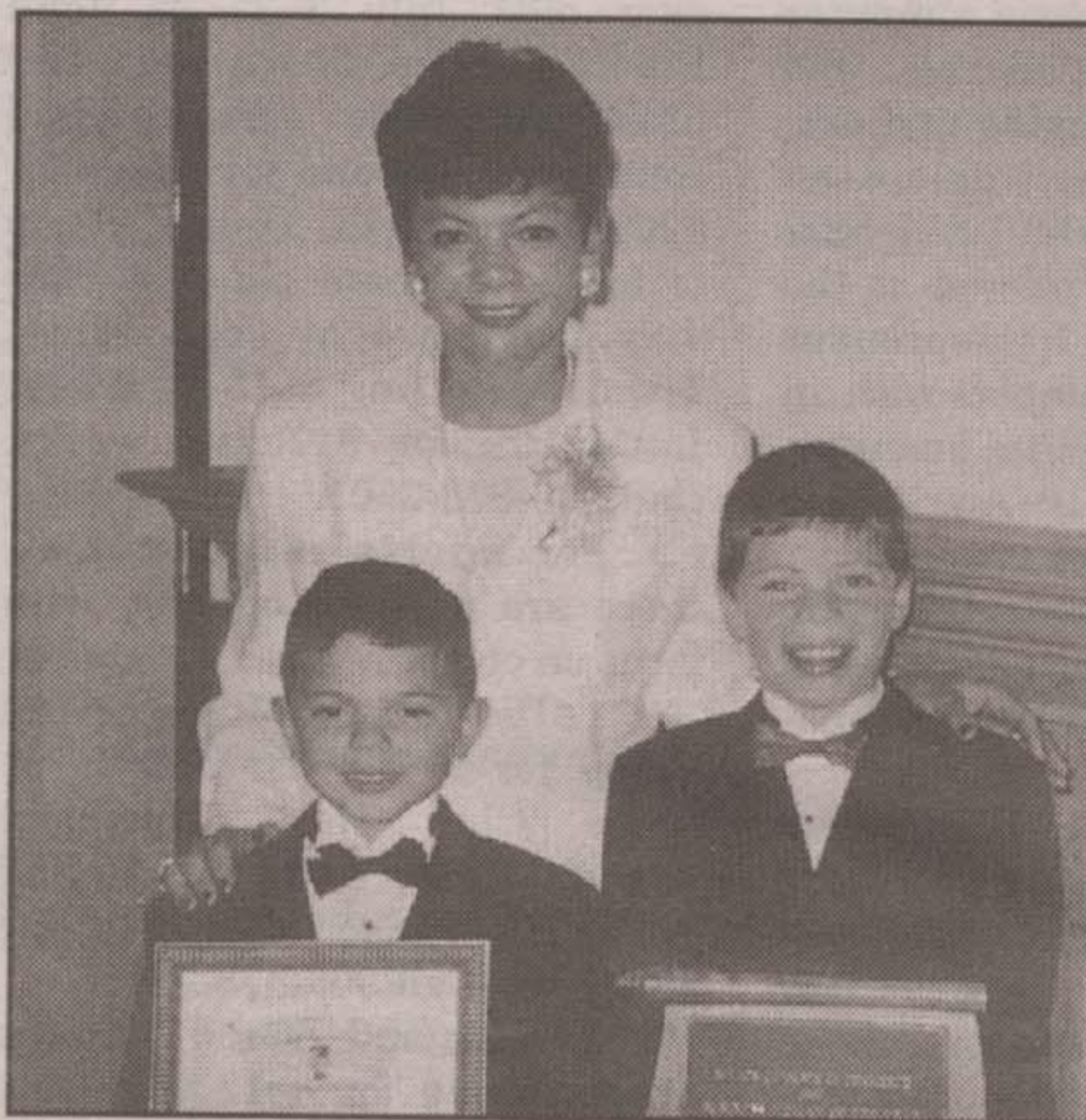


CONGRATULATIONS

The Town of Milton Council Recap

TRAILS MASTER PLAN: The consulting firm Marshall Macklin Monaghan is working with the Town on a Trails Master Plan. A Public Open House was held April 26th but it is not too late to comment. SURPLUS LAND: Many of you alert folks noticed that a portion of land at the SW corner of 15 Sideroad and Guelph line was for sale, having been declared surplus. Don't panic, the Cenotaph is NOT for sale. This is 1500 square feet that will be sold to the Region for the reconstruction of the intersection and installation of stop lights. It is a part of public notification that is legally required anytime property owned by the Town changes title.

CLOVER FARMS: Council approved a Zoning By-law Amendment permitting redevelopment of Clover Farms for gas station, convenience store, and residence (15 Sideroad & the Guelph Line.)

GUELPH LINE: Preliminary work on the Guelph Line is underway. Reconstruction will begin in June for completion in 2000. However, landscaping and final restoration cannot begin until the Spring of 2001.

FLAMBOROUGH: The Region of Halton was asked to consider the proposal to divide Flamborough into three sections, with one section attached of Halton. Following extensive analysis, Regional Council (as well as Milton Town Council) voted that they could not support the proposal because of the tangible cost implications, as well as the long term associated costs for services such as the water/waste infrastructure that would have to be contracted through Hamilton. Cost estimates ranged from \$20 million (Flamborough) to \$47 million (Hamilton.). Ultimately, the Province will have the final word and this decision is pending.

HOSPITAL NEWS: The Emergency department at Milton District Hospital is now open with a Doctor on staff 24 hours a day. The program, funded by Halton Healthcare Services and the Province's Alternative Funding Arrangement, was implemented two months ago and seems to be working successfully. Congratulations to the Milton District Hospital Foundation on their 20th Anniversary, and many thanks to the Foundation for the \$150,000 donation to HHS. The MDH Auxiliary will hold their traditional Garage Sale on May 6th. Watch for their famous Strawberry Social on June 17th! Thanks to the Milton Oldtimers Hockey Team, for their donation that will assist Rehabilitation Services at MDH in purchasing a laser for the Hand Program to treat soft tissue injuries.

HYDRO RESTRUCTURING: Milton Council determined will use a search firm to assist in the recruitment of Directors for the Board of the new Milton Hydro Corporation. Council has recommended a Phase in Program to mitigate the expected rate increases over three years.

NCCC: Special thanks to the Nassagaweya Community Consultation Committee for their efforts this month to make our community a better place! Jan Mowbray has taken stellar leadership in the week-long activities of the Milton Road Safety Challenge committee. Jean Woods is organizing the Road Cleanup Day on May 6th. You too can help! 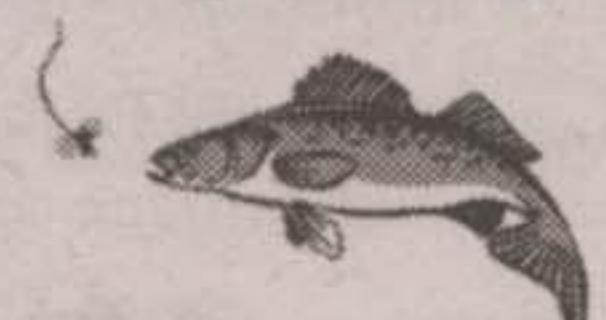
