
Katelyn Laidlaw, Pineview Public School


Aaryn Fraser, P.W. Merry Public School







LIMEHOUSE RESIDENT WINS NATIONAL SAFETY AWARD







100 YEARS OF HALL FAMILY REUNIONS



100 YEARS OF REUNIONS: The Hall family gathered for the above photo at the Hall homestead on Lot 11, Conc. 8, Trafalgar Township in 1950.

Following a tradition set in 1900, The Asa Hall family are holding a reunion on Saturday, June 4 at the Boyne Community Centre. Asa Hall (1772 - 1843) and his wife Sarah Nicholls came first to Plymouth, Mass. and then to Canada. They were of United Empire Loyalist stock. Asa and Sarah had ten children.

Their son Albert, (1815 – 1906) married Elizabeth Bray and purchased a farm on Lot 11, Conc. 8, Trafalgar Township. Their son George (1848 - 1930) married Sarah Ann Mason and they continued to farm.

Their son Victor (1883 - 1962) also tilled the Hall farm, served on Trafalgar Council for 11 years and was Warden of Halton County in 1939. He was also Roads Superintendent for 10 years and married Eveline Stark from the Scotch Block of Esquesing Township. His brother Stan (1888 - 1962) was Halton's Member of Parliament winning elections from 1943 to 1959.

Victor's son George also farmed Lot 11. After his death, the Hall farm was sold in 1987. However, the family continues to hold its annual reunions.
