Even more interesting is a honey pot beeswax candle with dipper; when the honey is done, the shell can be used with candles.

The trickle of indoor water fountains murmurs in the background as shoppers eye the numerous shelves and wallspace. Each holds a new delight, and it's no wonder that visitors have told owner Lisa Stoodley that they don't want to leave - her space is so soothing and enjoyable.

"I really love the store. I've been able to make it personal -

with the serenity of the water and everything. I enjoy the arts very much - I've done a lot of my own artwork, and made a few dolls. I thought I'd try my hand at a store because I enjoy it."

Out of the immediate geographic area, shoppers can select an item from Jan Stevens, who creates toad houses and bird feeders; photographic nature art by Peter and Marilyn Doney of Etobicoke, or the watercolour work of Rachel Anne from New Brunswick.

Along with one of a kind items, Lisa is an authorized Bradford Group dealership, carrying ornaments (the most successful of which are by Lena Lui) and art plates.

"It's Christmas all year here," she mentions, smiling, especially with the range of decorations that arrive daily.

Lisa has two assistants in her shop: Marie, who works part time, and Lisa's son Ryan, who is a great help with receiving goods and talking to customers. He also gives his mother's work a preferential plug to anyone in the store.


