Keeping the home fires burning

Here we are experiencing cool nights, seeing coloured leaves, and getting children outfitted for school. Doesn't that mean fall? As I thought about recipes this month I thought some nutritious and tasty snacks for school might be welcome. Of course they can be used for other events as well. These squares will carry well.

If you keep celery and carrot sticks cut up in a dish in the fridge the children could be responsible for getting them ready for their lunch bags. Apples cut up and sprinkled with cinnamon are nice for a change. Cherry tomatoes and a tasty sandwich and any of the squares would make a nutritious lunch.

Brownies Deluxe

½ cup shortening

1 cup white sugar

l egg, beaten

3 tsp. cocoa

2/3 cup rolled fine graham wafers

1 tsp. vanilla

½ cup chopped walnuts

Graham wafers to line a baking pan

Heat the shortening, sugar, egg and cocoa in a saucepan and boil one minute. Stir constantly. Remove from heat, add rolled wafers, vanilla and nuts. Line 8x8x2 inch pan with whole graham wafers. Spread mixture over them. Set in refrigerator to chill. When firm, ice with your favourite icing. I use 2/3 cup chocolate chips and 1 tbsp. butter, melted, in the microwave. Squares stay firm so they carry well.

Blond Brownies

34 cup all purpose flour 1 tsp. baking powder ¼ tsp. salt 1/4 cup butter or margarine 1 cup packed brown sugar legg

1 tsp. vanilla

½ cup chopped nuts

Mixed flour, baking powder and salt well, set aside. In a saucepan melt butter; remove from heat. Stir in sugar until well blended. Stir in flour mixture, then nuts. Spread in greased 8x8x2 inch pan. Bake in preheated 350F oven for 25 minutes, or until pick inserted in the centre comes out clean. Cool in pan and cut in squares.

Chewy Chocolate Bars

1 300 g. package chocolate morsels 1 can low fat or regular condensed milk 34 cup softened butter

1¼ cups packed brown sugar

2 eggs

1½ cups all purpose flour 34 cup rolled oats

½ tsp. salt

Melt chocolate with condensed milk. Cool. Cream butter and brown sugar until light. Beat in eggs. Blend in flour, rolled oats and salt. Spread half of mixture in greased 13x9 inch pan. Spread chocolate mixture evenly over base. Spread remaining dough over chocolate layer. Bake at 350 F for 30 to 35 minutes. Cool and cut into bars.
