## Glorious autumn colours at Halton Parks

The curtain is rising on Ontario's spectacular autumn foliage, and there's no better place than the show near home, in Halton's conservation parks.

Conservation Halton has more than 9,000 acres of natural lands that include waterfalls, limestone cliffs, scenic lookouts and a vast network of forests. A trail system of 100 kilometers in length – including the Bruce Trail – is available for hiking, mountain biking and scenic viewing.

The glorious autumn show only lasts a few weeks, usually peaking around the Thanksgiving weekend. Weather has a lot to do with the brilliance of colours. An

ample amount of rainfall, sunny days and cool nights produce the best results. This combination allows the sugars in the leaves to produce a red pigment known as anthocyanin. Green chlorophyll eventually disappears as the red pigment becomes trapped and changes to brilliant reds, oranges and golds.

You can also view the colours by hopping in your car and taking a scenic driving tour on some of the wooded backroads of the Halton watershed. You personal "hunt for red October" can be made easier with three scenic driving tours that are shown in the stunning book *Halton: Rising*, Wild and Beckoning, published in 1998 by the Conservation Halton Foundation. 
