projects to proceed without the need to debenture, a significant saving in interest charges.

Projects of particular interest to rural residents include almost \$1 million related to Fire Department equipment & facilities (including design for the Campbellville Station), knoll removal on Twiss road between 5 Sideroad and Reid Sideroad (\$55,000), reconstruction of McNiven Road (pending a design report) and/or another rural road (\$385,000), new roof for the Lion's Hall (\$23.000), reconstruction of the First Line & 17 Sideroad intersection (\$70,000), "gateway" implementation, including Campbellville & Hamlets (\$100,000), a study for a Works Yard & Animal Shelter (\$25,000), additional parking in Campbellville (\$110,000). (Railway crossing protection at 3 Sideroad & McNiven road has been carried forward from the 2000 budget.) The Town is also submitting projects under the Provincial Superbuild partnership. The Proposal includes enhancement of the Tennis Court & Recreational facilities located adjacent to the Campbellville Fire Station. The Operating Budget will soon be considered at which point tax rates will be set.

PUBLIC MEETINGS: Two public meeting regarding proposed Amendments to the Zoning By-law were held. The proposed amendments would permit an Eating Establishment at 85 Campbellville Avenue West (Margaret & Allan Lott) and an Accessory Farm Dwelling at 10253 Second Line Nassagaweya (Chris Christoforou.). Council requested technical reports, including public comments, and will consider these two amendments at a future meeting.

GOLF COURSE STUDY: Council received and endorsed the Halton Golf Course study, identifying concerns of golf course development on prime agricultural land below the Escarpment Brow, permitting consideration above the Brow within guidelines, while recognizing concerns of individual property rights.

BY-LAW OFFICER: Milton welcomes Roy Smith, joining Ray Barlett as Municipal Law Enforcement Officers. Roy recently retired as a Staff Sergeant with the Halton Regional Police Services, including assignment Nassagaweya as a Community Policing officer where he participated in the NCCC.

DUFFERIN QUARRY EXTEN-SION: Dufferin Aggregates will be requesting licensing to extend its Quarry located in Milton & Halton Hills. Copies of the proposal are available for public viewing at the Planning & Development Department as well as the Public Library. An Open House will be held on February 13th. COUNTRY HERITAGE PARK: Council approved two major signs adjacent to the 401 which will identify the park and special events.

However, it denied two additional "third party" signs (billboards) on the property since these are not permitted under current sign by-law.

DOG TAGS: This may be the country, but dog licenses are required. It's in everyone's best interest, including the dog. Fees are \$40 for new registrations, and \$30 for renewals. A new program offers a lifetime registration of \$50 for dogs with Microchips.


