my'm still in the casserole mood here but I promise you this is the last one this win-Lter. I've made this twice since Christmas and it makes two casseroles and freezes nicely too.

Turkey Casserole

11/2 cups uncooked macaroni

4 cups leftover turkey, cubed

½ cup chopped onion ½ cup diced celery

½ tsp. sale

1/4 tsp. pepper

½ tsp. dry mustard

1 tbsp. flour

l cup grated cheese

1 cup cooked green beans, drained

2 cans creamed soup (mushroom, chicken or celery)

1/4 cup milk

1/4 cup grated cheese

cup buttered bread crumbs

METHOD:

Cook macaroni in boiling salted water until tender. Do not overcook. Mix the first 10 ingredients very gently in a bowl. Mix soup and milk. Pour over the above and stir gently. Put into two casserole dishes. Sprinkle with cheese and crumbs. Bake ½ hour or until hot and bubbly in a 350°F oven. Enjoy one, and freeze the other.

Raspberry Coconut Squares

½ cup softened butter

1/4 cup sugar

1 cup all purpose flour

½ cup raspberry jam

2 eggs

I pkg. lemon pie filling

1½ cups coconut flakes METHOD:

Cream butter and sugar. Add flour and press firmly into bottom of 8" pan. Bake at 350°F for 18 to 20 minutes. Remove from the oven and spread jam over the crust. Beat eggs and add pie filling (dry) and coconut. Spread over the ham. Bake another 30 minutes at 350°F.

Yum-Yums

Mix together 11/4 cups flour, 1 tbsp. brown sugar and 1/3 cup butter. pack into bottom of 8x8" pan. Topping:

2 eggs, slightly beaten

1½ cups brown sugar 1 tsp. vanilla

1 tsp. salt

1 cup coconut ½ cup chopped nuts

Spread topping onto crumbs that have been firmly packed. Bake at 350°F for 25 minutes or until

lightly browned.

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
