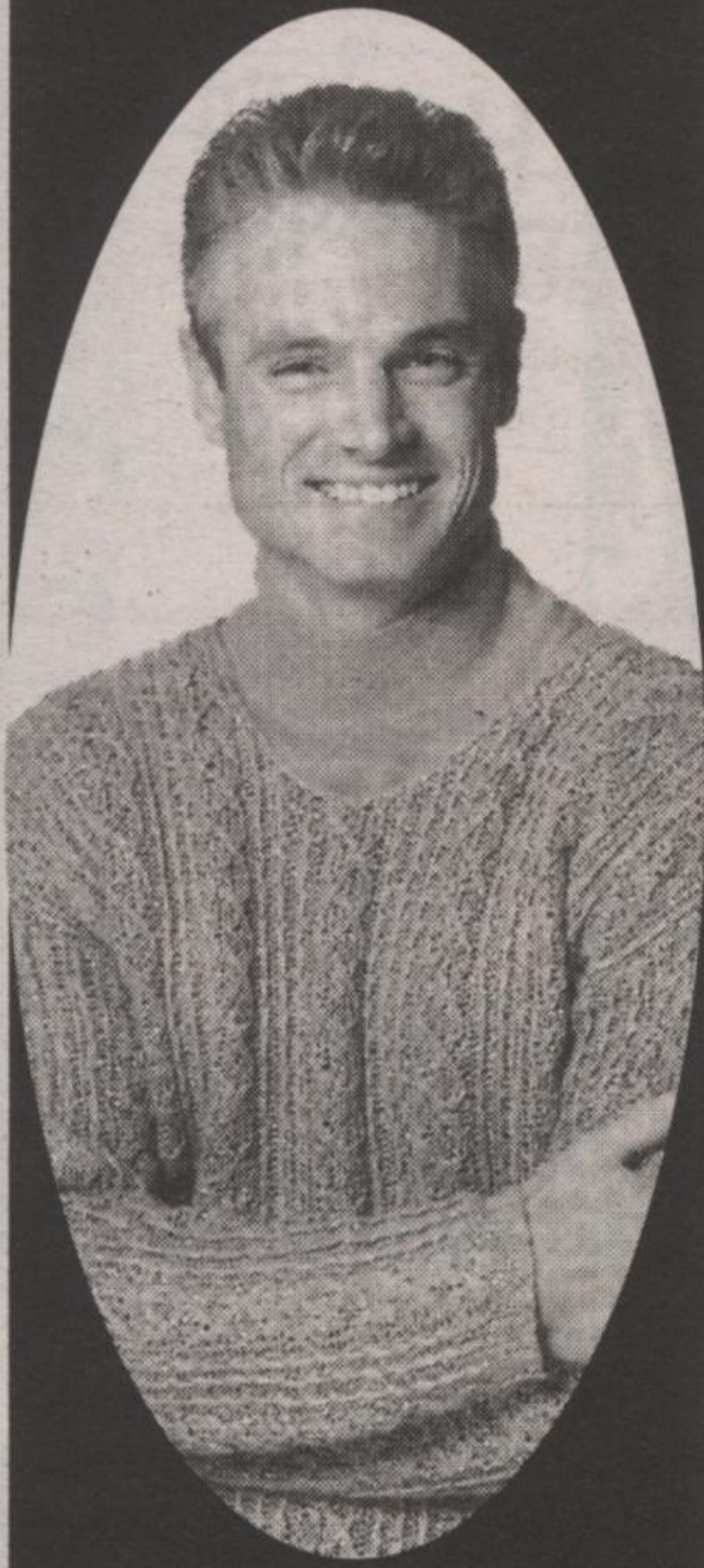

CAUTION: Dentures over five years old?

Limehouse Kiln Society receives grant

The Limehouse Kiln Society is pleased to announce they have received a grant from the Ministry of Tourism, Culture and Recreation to assist with the development of a plan to preserve and restore the lime kilns and related structures. These kilns are located on publicly owned and privately owned lands in and surrounding the village of Limehouse. The kilns are in various stages of deteriora-

tion and intervention is needed quickly to prevent these structures from further damage. The Limehouse Kiln Society is a local community group that was formed to look at ways to preserve, restore, and provide information to Bruce Trail users on the village's lime kilns and related structures. Current partners of the Limehouse Kiln Society include The Bruce Trail Association, Credit Valley Conservation, Blue Circle Aggregates, and J.C. Duff Sand and Gravel Ltd., and the Town of Halton Hills.

The Limehouse Kiln Society is issuing a request for proposals through the Association of Canadian Heritage Professionals. The Society will use the funding received to hire experts on heritage

restoration and conservation to help gather information on the kilns, assess preservation priorities, assess the sites for trail access, and develop interpretive information that can be used in the preservation and restoration process. The Society was fortunate to receive help in developing the criteria for our request for proposal from Sean Fraser at the Toronto Historical Board (who donated his time and expertise in this area to our group).

A meeting will be held as the preservation and restoration plan is developed to present recommendations and findings for public input.

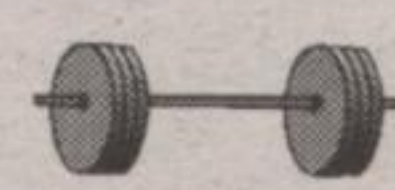
