SPECIAL DAYS:

June 9th is National Kids' Day (what a fitting day for the Brookville School Fair!)

FIRE HALL: Council received the Feasibility Study for the Milton Fire Department at its May 28th meeting. This report recognizes what has long been discussed - the Campbellville Fire Station needs serious work. The report recommends integrating a Regional Ambulance service into a new facility to be constructed on Reid Sideroad, adjacent to Ridley Windows. Nassagaweya Tennis Club would remain at its current location, with the possibility of expanded recreational facilities. The new Station 2 will be moved forward for 2002 Capital Budget considerations. A community Open House/Workshop will be held prior to finalizing the design. Watch for the date of this meeting, or contact any of us and we will notify you personally when this date is set.

DUFFERIN QUARRY:

Dufferin Aggregates has made application to redesignate and rezone lands north of the existing quarry (Milton & Halton Hills) for further extraction. A Public Meeting was held in Milton Council on May 28th receiving public comments, both in support and with concerns. This application is complicated, involving many agencies and approvals. It is being reviewed through JART (Joint Application Review Team) with Milton as one of the participating parties. If you wish to add your comments or be notified when the Technical Report will be presented to Council, please notify the Town Planning Department. This Report is expected to be complete sometime this fall.

Some dates to note:

The Region Public Meeting is set for September 5th. The Niagara Escarpment Commission holds its Plan Review in Milton, August 7th - 10th. (Delegations are asked to register for this meeting by June 1st, but will be accommodated after date as possible.) Dufferin Quarries holds their Annual Open House on June 23rd.

RURAL CLEANUP:

ROAD SAFETY CHALLENGE:

The Road Safety Committee of Milton, led by Jan Mowbray, competed in the Provincial Road Safety Challenge competition, with a full week of activities. Milton has a most unenviable record of having the highest percentage increase in vehicle collisions and road related deaths in 2000 in the Region of

CANADA DAY:

Celebration plans are well underway! This year will include activities on Saturday, as well as all-day Sunday. Set this weekend aside and enjoy this special day with your family and neighbours at Rotary Park in Milton.

CN INTERMODAL TERMINAL:

Speculation continues. However, until CN makes application for this Terminal, it is difficult to address the concerns and/or opportunities for such a facility. The Town & Region, in conjunction with CN, will proceed with Peer Review studies in anticipation of this Application.

MILTON TRIATHLON June 3rd:

This annual event has become increasingly popular. The Swim & Run portion takes place at Kelso, and the Bicycle event tours Nassagaweya. Participation could reach 1,000 this year. To minimize danger to both residents and athletes, the route will be closed to all but essential traffic from 9 a.m. to Noon, but even essential traffic should expect delays at the height of the Bicycle portion of the race. Roads that will be affected are Sixth Line Nassagaweya from 5 Sideroad to 20 Sideroad, 20 Sideroad from Sixth Line Nassagaweya to Fifth Line Nassagaweya, Fifth Line Nassagaweya from 20 Sideroad to 15 Sideroad.

NO TRUCK DESIGNATION:

30 Sideroad west of First Line Nassagaweya (Arkell Road) and First Line Nassagaweya north of 30 Sideroad will be designated as No Truck zones. This is intended to prevent this section from being used as a Guelph bypass for trucks and tractor-trailers. It is not intended to preclude use by local haulers or service to the immediate area.

FARMER'S MARKET:

This traditional event, pioneered by Nassagaweya farmers, once again returns to Main Street every Saturday, 6 a.m. - 12:30 p.m. through October.

NCCC MEETING:

Next meeting June 18 Monday, 10 a.m. in the Boardroom of Nassagaweya Community Centre, Brookville.

TAXES:

The mill rate is currently being set, now that the Education portion is known. It is quite possible that the due date for the Third Installment will be moved to the end of July because of this delay. However, the Final Installment will remain due the end of September.

This is the time of year when you should be checking your well. It is always a good idea, but it is especially important during spring run


