"This place is meant to inspire


- the stone, the wood - I've loved

Wendy Evans, a Guelph resident, has recently purchased Eden Place in Eden Mills and will be showcasing her line of stained glass in the historic building. Evans is working hard to create a fresh environment, welcoming the village residents and tourists to the shop. The front windows are decorated for spring, and inside the building is a

growing display of whimsical glass creations, such as beveled glass angels, sun catchers of unusual design, and glass checker sets. There are "nature dishes" in soft earthy colours with thought-provoking sayings, and elements of the world around us: fused glass stars, moons, snowflakes or birds.

"I want to have a place where a woman can walk in and find a gift for herself, a sister, a mother... I want this place to be welcoming."

Evans will have her own operational studio inside, as well as keeping the post office open for the convenience of residents. She hopes to offer basic classes in the summer, for which she will supply all the materials to create a simple



glass item. The classes will probably take place on Saturdays, about three hours from start to finish. Afterward, if students are inspired by what they create, they may further their study in Guelph.
