Campbellville Groundwater study nears completion

The Hamlet of Campbellville, I perched on the brow of the Niagara Escarpment, has a plentiful supply of good quality groundwater according to an investigation recently completed by Azimuth Environmental for the Region of Halton and the Town of Milton.

"Campbellville is at the upper end of a significant groundwater system that is used by Halton Region to supply Milton's water supply. A large valley, infilled with sand and gravel, exists immediately to the east of Campbellville that serves to funnel groundwater from above the Niagara Escarpment down to the municipal well field in - water safe in Campbellville." Kelso Conservation Area. The groundwater used at Kelso travels right through the center of Campbellville," says Steve Holysh, Halton Region's hydrogeologist. "For this reason, as well as to ensure quality groundwater for Campbellville's residents, we have to be cautious about any approved land use changes in the Campbellville area."

The year-long groundwater investigation has evaluated the water quantity and quality in Campbellville. The study made effective use of the Region's water well database.

"This resource was invaluable during the study," noted Azimuth representatives. "The Region should be applauded on their foresight to develop such planning tools."

The study results will, among other things, provide local and regional councils with a tool to make future decisions regarding development potential in

Campbellville.

The study findings will be presented at a public meeting on June 16, 2001 upstairs at the Lion's Club Community Hall in Campbellville from 7 to 9 pm. A formal presentation will be made at 7:30 pm. The Steering Community will finalize the report after receiving public comments at this open house.

"Water protection has become an important issue with local homeowners over the past year," notes Murray Inglis, a long-time resident of Campbellville and a member of the study's Steering Committee. "We want to keep the

BMX will be the host of the Maple Leaf National, the only Canadian stop on the National Bike League's BMX War of the Star Race Series. More than 1,000 riders and 2,000 spectators are expected to attend that weekend for this one-of-a-kind

Canadian event. BMX (bicycle moto-cross) racing has grown into an internationally recognized cycling discipline, where athletes pit their skills against other competitors on a dirt track that features jumps, bumps and high banked turns. Track 2000 President Mark Brancier is quick to note that it's also a family sport.

"We have riders from fouryear-olds to 62-year-olds. It's a family time that's dedicated to you and your kids, when there often seem to be far too few days to do that now. And no one sits on the bench, everybody participates at their own level."

Track 2000, located on the Northwest corner of Britannia and Trafalgar Road at Drumquin Park is a non-profit organization run completely by volunteers. Mark tion. CITY-TV's Breakfast you at the races.

Brancier estimates that approximately 4200 hours of volunteer time goes into the park yearly.

"That's a huge commitment from the volunteers but no one complains because they do it for the kids. They realize that a safer, well graded track is safer for the children."

"I would say it'll be quite prestigious for Milton. BMX is the upcoming new sport that kids are leaning toward and the National puts us on the map as something exclusive, as it is the only one held in Canada." The race has already received a great deal of media atten-

Television will broadcast live from Track 2000 on Friday, June 21, and coverage will also be available on the Outdoor Life Network, as well as continual on-site attendance by two local radio stations.

Volunteers and local business sponsorships are being welcomed by Track 2000 in whatever capacity available, as expenses for this type of event can run high for a nonprofit organization.

"What the track desperately needs to become a national track is infrastructure, like plumbing, lighting, telephone lines and paving the berms," explains Brancier. Although the Town of Milton has helped to supply bleachers and fencing, and Mattamy Homes has supplied the dirt and some of the man-hours in building the track, much more is needed. Expenses such as the Porta Potties are being absorbed by the Track's limited budget.
