

A foundation for community work

Habitat for Humanity is an independent, non-profit Christian housing program dedicated to the elimination of poverty and substandard housing by building affordable homes in partnership with families in need. Homeowners contribute 500 hours of "sweat equity" to the construction of their own homes, and usually to other "builds," and then repay a long term interest-free mortgage. Mortgage costs are kept low by the use of volunteer labour and donations of money and materials.

Habitat for Humanity was founded in the US in 1976 by Linda and Millard Fuller. More than 100,000 homes in at least 68 countries have been built around the world. Habitat for Humanity Canada was founded in 1985, and has built more than 400 homes from coast to coast. It has at present 48 affiliate offices and campus chapters in all ten provinces, helping to eliminate poverty housing.

Former US President Jimmy Carter and his wife Rosalyn have been involved since 1984. They volunteer at a Jimmy Carter Work Project "blitz" build each year. In 1993, he visited Winnipeg and challenged former Governor General the Rt. Hon. Edward Schreyer and his wife Lily to become involved and promote a build, which they have done each succeeding year.

Habitat Humanity for Wellington County has acquired two building lots in the town of Rockwood. Their intention is to build two semi-detached houses on the lots. The first is to be built this summer from July 2 and continues for three weeks. Excavating has already been done. Local churches have donated funds. Local contractors, building supply businesses, plumbing services and many more have agreed to donate materials and time. It is hoped that the second

house can be built in 2002 in partnership with Campus Chapters at the University of Guelph and Sir Wilfrid Laurier University. This will be the first student build of its kind in Canada.

A benefit concert will be held in Rockwood United Church on Friday, June 15 at 7:30 p.m. Rev. Glen Soderholm from Nassagaweya will be featured. Advance tickets (\$15 adults, \$8 children) can be purchased from Deb Quaile at 519-856-2386, or get them at the door.




HERITAGE TEA FOR HERITAGE QUILT

In 1945 the Limehouse Women's Institute purchased the Methodist Church in Limehouse and dedicated it as the Limehouse Memorial Hall in memory of the men and women who served in the wars. A community canvas was conducted to help pay for the hall. In the same year the Women's Institute made this quilt, embroidering the names of those who donated and their families. The large star in the middle has the names of the women who held office in the Institute from 1922 to 1945. This quilt was returned to the hall this January by Olive Ellerby, whose mother-in-law was president in 1945. The Institute has framed it and are having a Heritage Tea on June 24

from 2 to 4 pm to unveil it. An effort is being made to contact as many families as possible who donated at that time. All are welcome!


