

Milton Council Briefs

FIREWORKS BYLAW: This Bylaw regulates the sale & discharge of fireworks. Fireworks can only be discharged on specific days, including Canada Day, except with special permission. Permits are required as issued by the fire

department. If discharged on town owned property, permission and proof of insurance are required. More information is available through the Clerk's office.

BURNING PERMITS: Permits are required for open air burning in

the rural area. There is no cost to obtain a permit, but a site map and a phone call previous to burning is essential. If the fire department responds to an emergency call and you do not have a permit, you will be billed for the emergency call. This includes evening bon fires. Remember to call when the fire is out. (I didn't, & this note is my penance.)

NO TRUCK DESIGNATION: A solution has been found to prevent tractor-trailers & trucks from using 30 Sideroad & First Line Nassagaweya (Arkell Road) as a Guelph by-pass. First Line Nassagaweya north of 30 Sideroad will be designated as a No Truck zone. 30 Sideroad and the balance of First Line Nassagaweya will not be designated. This should allow local haulers to use this route, while preventing inappropriate use by large trucks using it as a by-pass.

TAXES: Provincial legislative revisions for the final 2001 billing

delayed the taxation by-law. The due dates for the two final tax billings are now July 31 & September 28, 2001. Milton taxes are based on a 0% increase, although there is about a 2% increase in the Regional share of taxes. Total Tax Rates follow: Rural Residential without Waste Management - 1.087747%. (An urban property with Waste Management is 1.160033%.) Farmlands I - .380714%. Farmlands II .1087747%. Taxes total \$48,348,588, with approximately \$9 million to the Town, \$12.6 million to the Region, \$4.7 million for Police Services, and \$22 million for Education. ASAP BUILDING PERMITS: Accelerated Service And Permits (ASAP) is a new building permit


service offered by the Town of Milton for a variety of small residential projects. If you are adding a deck, shed, one-storey addition, pool fencing, garage, fireplace, etc. you may be eligible for this program which can generally process an application within five working days. MILTON COMMUNITY FUND: Council approved the recommendations from CSAC (Community Services Advisory Committee) and awarded funding of \$270,000 to 28 organizations and two individuals in four categories. Initial requests from 55 applications totaled \$842,216. Some requests were deferred for further information, and in some cases only a portion of the request was awarded.

The deadline for the balance of the \$500,000 fund is October 1st, 2001. For more information and application forms, contact Joy Anderson at the Town.

WATER REPORT: The Region presented the draft of the Campbellville Aquifer Management Plan at a Public Meeting June 14th, which finds a great supply of good water available for the Campbellville area. The final report will be presented to Milton and Halton Region and Milton Councils later this summer.
