Keeping the home fires burning

Glenda's Kitchen Kapers

Although I am not a chocolate lover, I seem to be making many chocolate things. This Chocolate Dream dessert is a crowd pleaser and is great for potlucks because of its size.

Chocolate Dream Dessert

1 pkg. (181/2 oz.) chocolate cake mix

1 pkg. (3.4 oz.) instant vanilla pudding mix

1 cup chocolate syrup, divided

1 carton (12 oz.) frozen whipped topping, thawed

½ cup chopped pecans

Prepare and bake cake according to package directions, using a greased 13 in. x 9 x 2 in. baking pan. Cool on wire rack. Meanwhile, prepare pudding according to package directions; pour into another 13 x 9 x 2 pan. Tear cake into small pieces and gently push down into the pudding. Drizzle with 3/4 cup of chocolate syrup. Spread with whipped topping. Drizzle remaining chocolate syrup on topping. Sprinkle with pecans. Refrigerate until serving.

As most of you know, I am a lemon lover and like this lemon freeze.

Lemon Freeze

3/4 cup Kellogg's Corn Flakes, in crumbs

2 tbsp. sugar

1/4 cup butter or margarine, melted

2 eggs, separated

1 15 oz. can condensed milk

1/3 cup fresh lemon juice

½ tsp. grated lemon peel

3 tbsp. sugar

Combine corn flake crumbs, sugar and melted butter. Mix well. Save 2 to 4 tbsp. crumb mixture for topping and press the rest into an 8 inch pie pan or an ice cube tray, pressing firmly around sides and bottom. Beat egg yolks until thick and lemon coloured. Combine with condensed milk. Add lemon juice and peel. Stir until thickened. Beat egg whites until stiff but not dry. Gradually beat in sugar. Fold gently into lemon mixture. Pour into crumb lined pan. Sprinkle with remaining crumbs. Freeze until firm. Cut into wedges or bars to serve. May be garnished with fresh berries.

Where's the slots money going?



The first batch of slots dollars designated for the Milton Community Fund has been announced. Each year \$500,000 of the revenue generated by the Town of Milton from Mohawk Slots will be distributed through this fund. Fifty-five applications requested funding totalling \$842,216. Eight applications requesting a total of \$130,340 in funds were deemed ineligible and 12 applications have been deferred either at the organization's request or to provide more information for their proposal.

Fifty-four per cent of the money has been allocated, some to the following rural applicants: The Conservation Halton Foundation will receive \$5,000 to support Mountsberg Cameron Playbarn. The Halton Agricultural Society will receive \$15,950 to install a horse track for light and heavy horses at Milton Fairgrounds. Country Heritage Park will receive \$25,000 to support the construction of site identification signage to be located

on park property adjacent to Hwy 401 (conditional and dependent on an agreement allowing the Town of Milton to book some sign usage as per an agreement that determines terms of use). Campbellville Minor Baseball will receive \$5,482 of its \$55,482 request to support clinics, training material and equipment. Baseball Brookville Minor Association will receive \$7,000 of its \$10,000 request to provide training and certification for coaches and umpires and to purchase equipment. Halton 4-H Association will receive \$3,000 to support organization promotional activities.

All applicants will be notified as to the status of their application, including the distribution of cheques, by the end of June 2001. The next application deadline is October 1st. Applicants may only submit one application per year. To obtain an application package, contact Joy Anderson, Coordinator, Community Development at 905-702-3143.
