Tragic death saddens community

Dr. T.B. (Brian) Moore - physician, family man and friend - was struck by lightning on August 7 while on the deck of his cottage on Doe Lake near Burk's Falls. His death leaves a giant emptiness in the lives of his family, patients and community.

Dr. Moore was a compassionate gentleman who always had time to listen, truly care and dispense professional advice. When necessary, he was straightforward and serious. But more often his consultations included a healthy dose of humour. Dr. Moore was well respected as a doctor and a greatly loved man.

Born and raised in Campbellville, Dr. Moore attended high school in Milton where he met his wife Anne (Pickett). Following medical school, he formed one of the first, if not the first, medical groups in Acton, in 1962. The Moore's had planned to move to the Arboretum in Guelph this month, though he would continue to see his patients in Acton on a reduced schedule.

This is the second tragedy the Moore family has suffered in just five weeks. Dr. Moore's nephew, Carey Moore, died while performing at the Sarnia Air Show in July.

Dr. Moore's children and colleagues remembered him with affection through touching and perceptive eulogies. Portions of these eulogies, written by son-in-law Farid Khan can be found on page 10.
