Keeping the home fires burning

Glenda's Kitchen Kapers

We enjoyed our trip out west this summer and thoroughly enjoyed attending Bert's cousin's 40th wedding anniversary and renewing our friendships with relatives. When Helen heard we were coming she promptly wrote back delighted and jokingly suggested we might consider coming a day or two early so I could help get the food ready. Just for fun we did that and now I'm going to share a couple of those recipes.

Marinated Onions

1 cup boiling water

1 cup vinegar

1 cup sugar

celery seed

Onions (sliced)

1/2 cup sour cream

1/2 cup salad dressing

Pour boiling water, vinegar and sugar over the sliced onions and marinate all day. Drain. Add sour cream and salad dressing. Sprinkle with celery seed. I think we did about 3 or 4 pounds of onions. We had a 4 liter ice cream tub of onions anyway. This was for a gathering of 40. I intend to use half the recipe for home use.

Fruit Pizza

Crust: 1 1/4 cup flour

1/3 cup brown sugar

3 tbsp icing sugar

2/3 cup softened margarine

Mix together until forms a ball. Pat into pizza pan and bake at 350 for 10-15 minutes. Cool.

Topping: 12 oz. cream cheese

1/2 cup sugar

1 tsp vanilla

Beat together. Spread over cooled crust. Arrange the fruits of your choice on the topping.

Glaze: 1/2 cup water

1/2 cup orange juice

2 tbsp lemon juice

1/4 cup white sugar

1 tbsp cornstarch

Cook until thick. Pour glaze over the fruit. Cool.

Chocolate Syrup (served over ice cream)

3/4 cup cocoa

1/2 cup sugar

1/4 tsp salt

1 cup hot water 1/2 cup corn syrup

1 tsp vanilla

Mix cocoa, sugar, salt in hot water. Add corn syrup. Boil until right consistency (Approx. 1 min.). Add vanilla. Cool and store in fridge. This also works well in chocolate milk.

I also heard a good joke. Those of you who know Bert know how he gives me a hard time about leftovers. Helen, by the way is a United Church Minister, and she and Reg got a kick out of this joke too.
