Proposed Halton Hills Sports Park causes concern to local resident

Tt was reported in the September ■ 2001 issue of the North Halton Compass that Halton Region Official Plan Amendment No. 19 had received little to no community input. At press time we were not aware that a letter expressing concern had been filed with the Regional Clerk, about this amendment which would permit a sports facility (i.e. soccer fields, baseball diamonds, etc), a cemetery and expansion of a public works yard on 40 hectares of land located at the northwest corner of Trafalgar Road and 17 Side Road in Halton Hills.

Mr. John Kerins of Georgetown faxed his concerns to the clerk's office in advance of the public meeting which was held in August. Mr. Kerins outlined three concerns which are as follows:

"There is an apparent absence of any information/evaluation reports on the potential impact of the proposed new well on existing neighbourhood wells. There appears to be no provision for the

installation of site safety barriers along the C.P.R. tracks, Trafalgar Road and 17 Side Road to guard against the possibility of stray balls or other objects coming from the playing fields. And there is no mention of a 'traffic control plan' that would ensure the orderly and timely flow of traffic throughout the affected area. Currently, the heavy traffic flow along Trafalgar Road and particularly 17 Side Road (approximately 4 gravel trucks per minute throughout the day), are adversely affected by the C.P.R. train crossings, which occur approximately every hour for a 10 to 35 minute duration. This results in a two to three mile back-up of traffic along the main arterial roads."

The North Halton Compass apologizes to Mr. Kerins for the article in the September issue which indicated that no concerns had been presented to Amendment No. 19. A copy of the proposed amendment is available to the public. For more information call Steve Stone at 905-825-6000, ext 7186.






