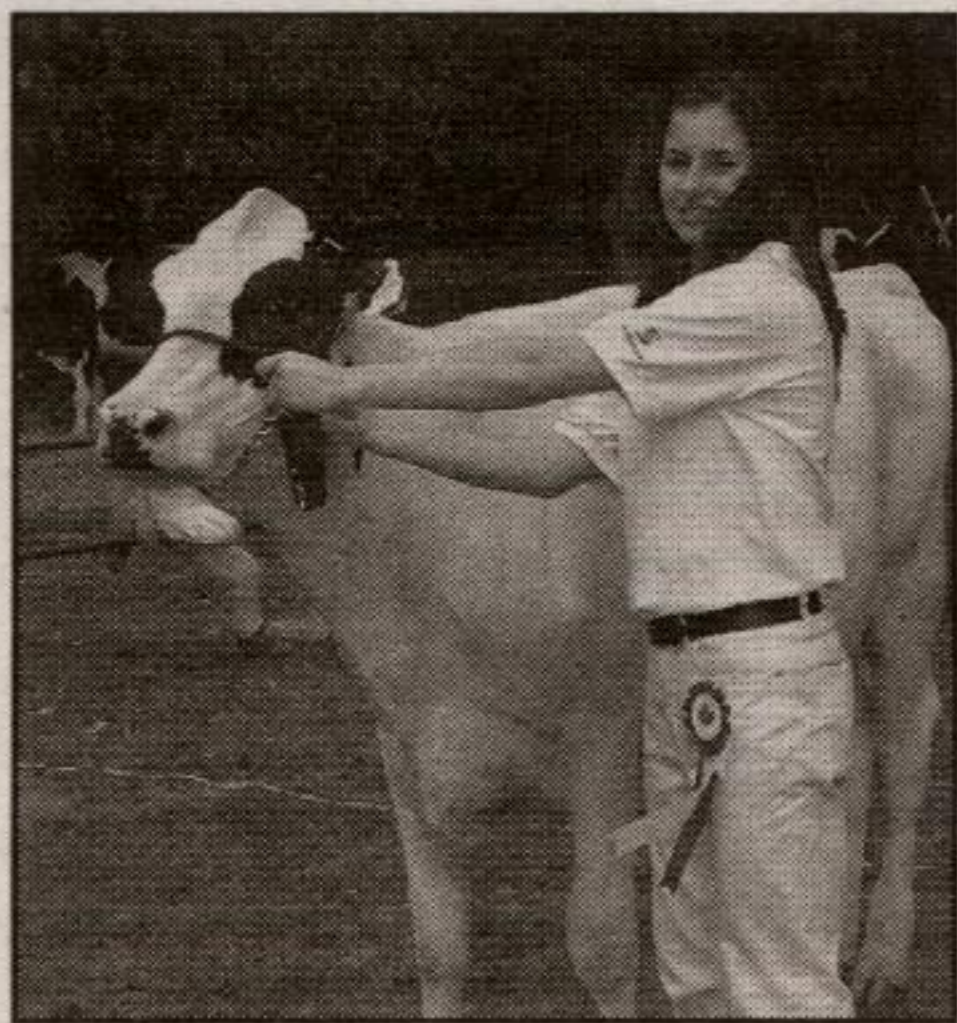

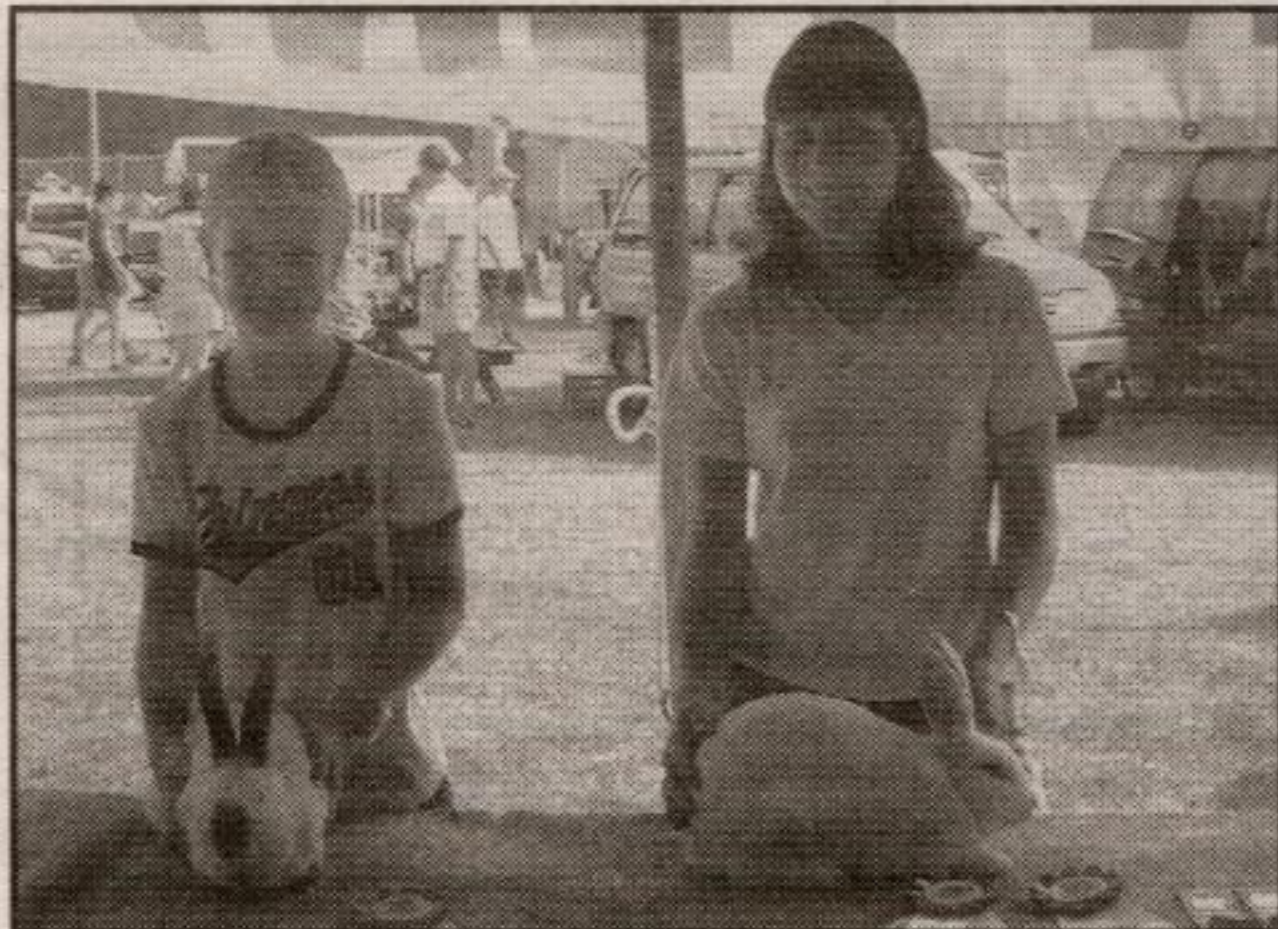

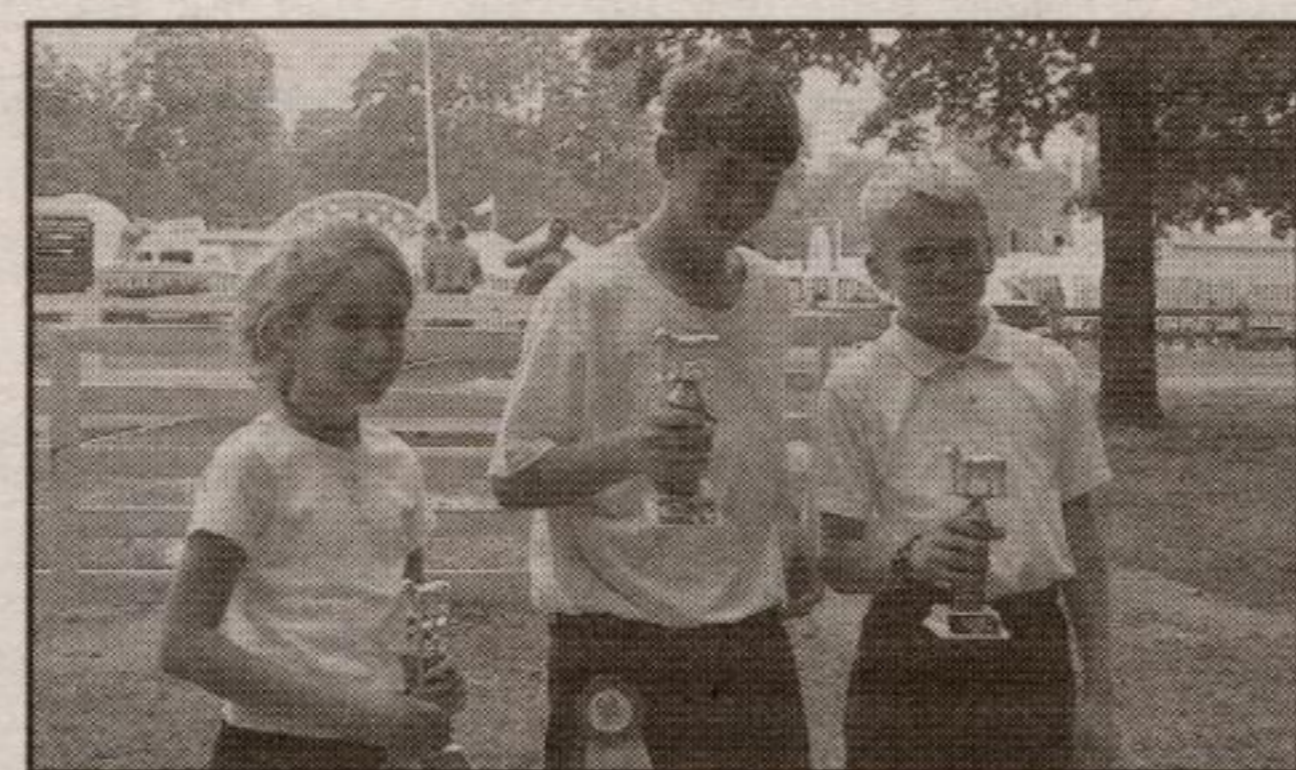

Rob Demille, the newly elected president of the Halton YPC, told members he was setting a goal of having at least one member in every grade, in every high school, in the riding of Halton.

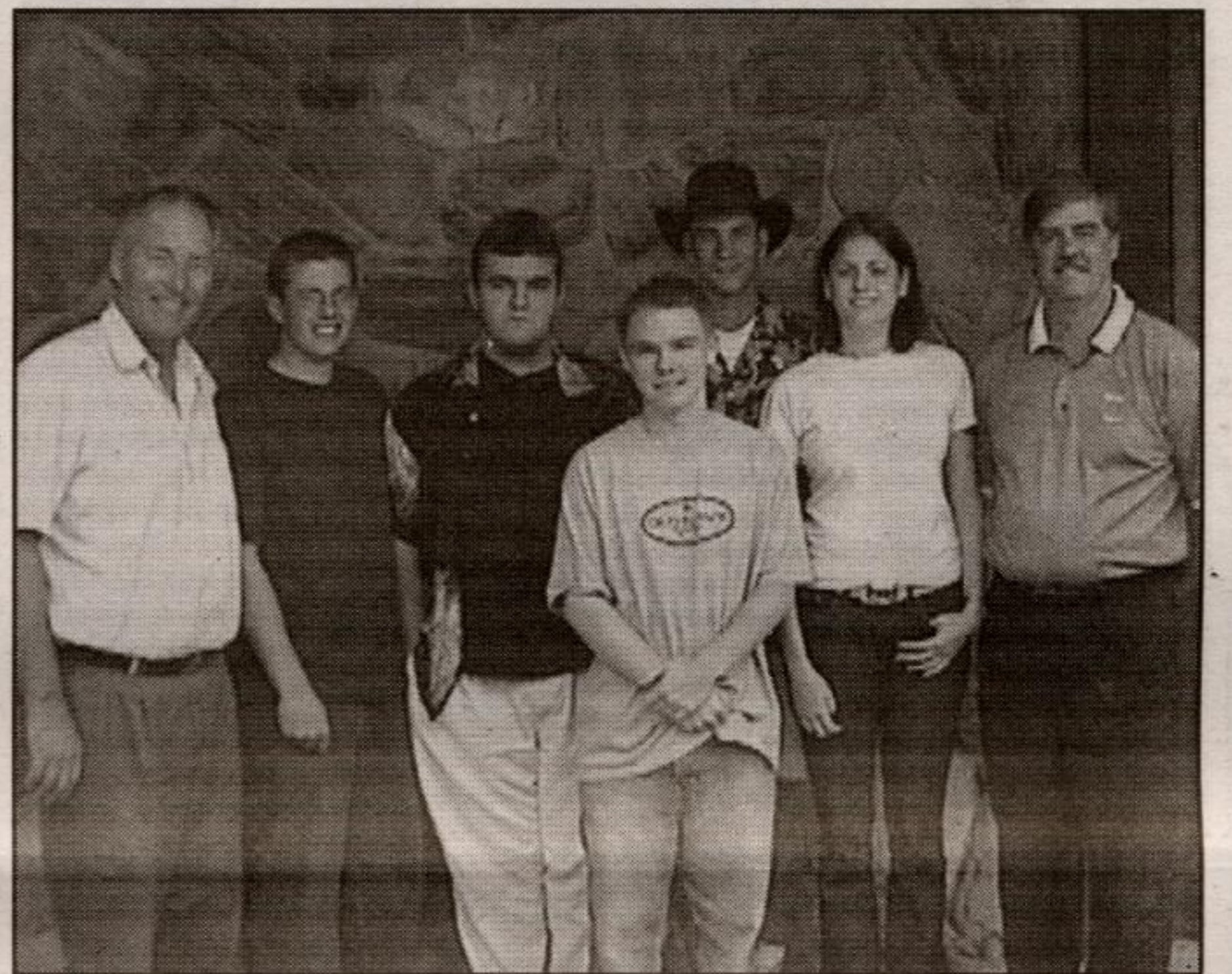
"It's important for young people to have a place to discuss their concerns," Mr. Demille said. "It's also important that youth take concrete and positive actions to get their voices heard."

Junior Achievement of Halton receive Trillium Grant

The Ontario Trillium Foundation has awarded a significant grant of \$173,600 over three years to support program expansion for Junior Achievement of Halton.

This three-year grant enables JA Halton to expand program offerings across the region. This past program year, 2000/2001, JA experienced a 20 percent growth in programs reaching 2065 students. The grant from the Ontario Trillium Foundation will assist JA Halton in reaching over 5,000 students this program year.

With the Ontario Trillium Foundation grant, Junior Achievement of Halton has hired a second full time program manager and will be adding a part time marketing manager to the team. With additional staff, the organization will be increasing current program delivery of Business Basics, Economics of Staying in School, The Company Program and will launch a new program, Dollars and Sense. This new offering now brings a full complement of programming from Grade 5 through to Grade 12/OAC.

Recognition of the award was made at the Annual General Meeting on September 19, 2001 at The Regional Municipality of Halton offices in Oakville.

The Ontario Trillium Foundation, an agency of the Ministry of Tourism, Culture and Recreation, receives annually \$100 million of government funding generated through Ontario's charity casino initiative.

Founded in 1967, Junior Achievement of Canada is a national organization that offers seven business education programs, delivered at no cost to elementary and high school students. Junior Achievement of Halton, serving the communities of Burlington, Halton Hills, Milton and Oakville is one of 32 chartered organizations operating across Canada. The programs currently offered by Junior Achievement of Halton are Business Basics (ages 10-11), Economics of Staying in School (ages 13-14) and the Company Program (ages 15-19).
