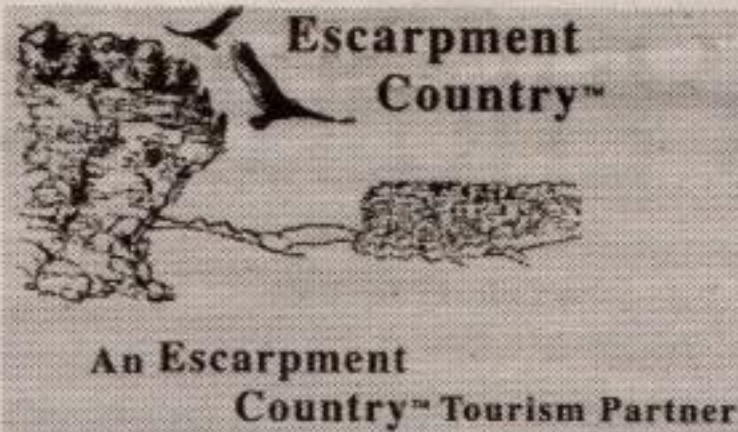

**Cenotaph service remembers those who brought freedom**

**T**he stone soldier, upon this cenotaph at the corner of Guelph Line and 15th Side Road, will again be on parade on November 4 commencing at 2 p.m., along with comrades from the Royal Canadian Legion, Branch 136, Milton. The familiar service to pay homage to those other comrades who paid the supreme sacrifice for the freedom of their country, during two World Wars.

More than 45,000 Canadians lost their lives in the second World War. Of the many campaigns involving Canadian airmen, soldiers and sailors the assault on Juno Beach, Normandy on June 6, 1944, stood out as marking the beginning of the end of Nazi tyranny in Europe.

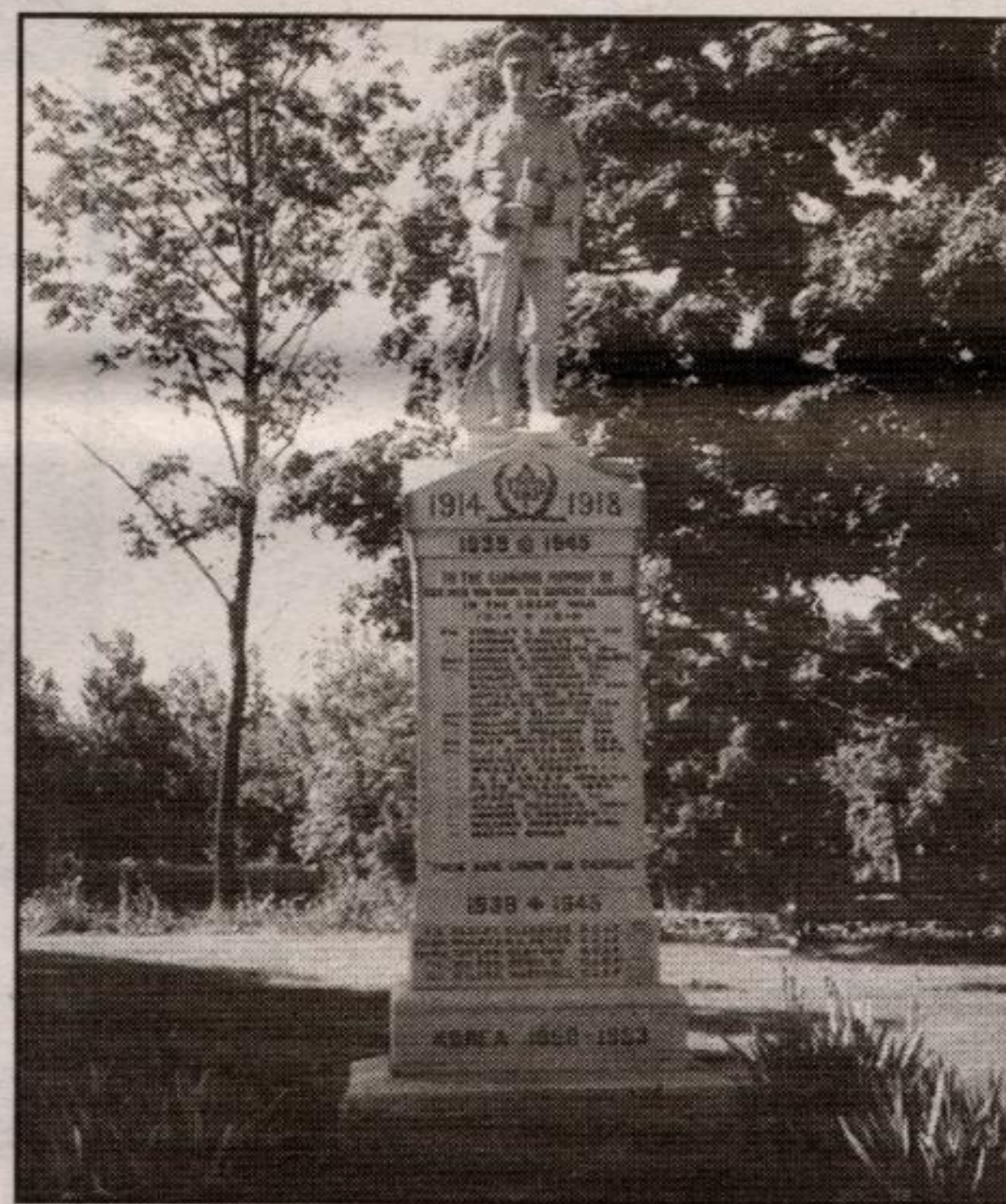

Cenotaph at corner of Guelph Line and 15th Side Road

After years of planning, construction will begin this fall of a Memorial to the Canadian who stormed the French Coast on D Day, 57 years ago. A five acre site

has been selected at the tiny seaside town of Courseulles-sur-Mer that borders the Juno Beachhead. It will feature a multi-media interpretation centre that will tell the story of Canadian military and civilian contributions to the liberation of Europe. The building, designed by Ontario architect Brian K Chamberlain, will incorporate the shape of the Order of Canada and the outline of a Maple Leaf. The monument will be clad in coloured titanium that resembles North American Autumn colours and will feature a large bronze sculpture of military figures in the courtyard. The total

cost of the construction is estimated to be \$6.1 million and the grand opening is scheduled for June 6, 2002.

As the veterans stand in silence at the Haltonville Corners in Brookville this year there will be an extra prayer for those who lost their lives in the more recent conflict in New York. The memory of the cowardly attack on our neighbours to the south brings home the stark reality of war and its consequences.

As long as the stone soldier stands on guard, we will remember them.
