November, 2001 SPECIAL DAYS: November 20 is National Child Day.

REMEMBRANCE DAY: November 11. Remembrance Day Parades and Services will be held on both November 4 and 11 to allow the Royal Canadian Legion, veterans and grateful citizens to observe this occasion at both Milton and Haltonville cenotaphs. The Nassagaweya ceremonies will begin with a Parade at 2 p.m. and Memorial Service at 2:30 p.m. on Sunday, November 4, proceeding to the Haltonville Cenotaph (corner of Guelph Line & 15 Sideroad). The Milton parade and service will be held on Sunday afternoon, 2 and 2:30 p.m., November 11.

GTSB: The Greater Toronto Services Board will meet through November 30 in order to complete project and GTSB Functions as a result of the Provincial decision to dissolve this Board.

SPEED LIMIT POLICY: Council accepted a report which recommended continuation of the current speed limits, with the provision for considering changing limits in site-specific areas.

STOKREST ESTATES: This subdivision proposes 34 homes on 46 acres at the west boundary of the Campbellville Hamlet, between Campbell Avenue and Reid Sideroad. Council directed staff to continue with the Technical Report that will address crucial issues such as water supply, septic, traffic, and other local concerns. The required public meeting was held October 22. However, interested residents can still review the plan and are encouraged to submit comments. 

Milton Council and Town Staff are reviewing development options for three significant public facilities in the Town of Milton:


