Crawford Lake creating new Master Plan

It's time for change. A public Linformation session was held at Crawford Lake Conservation Area to unveil its new Master Plan on Tuesday, October 23.

The Ministry of Natural Resources requires that all of the parks within the Niagara Escarpment Plan have a Master Plan in place and a Master Plan also helps Conservation Halton develop capital budgets for the Park, to meet the needs of the visitors.

"If you're not moving forward, then you don't need a plan," explained Burchett, Bob Conservation Halton Director of Conservation Lands Services. "If you are moving forward, then you need a framework for implementation. There was a Master Plan done many years ago but it was out of date and out of touch. We started over and what we have is based on years of operating experience."

The Master Plan calls for the building of three more longhouses, at an estimated cost of \$300,000 each. The two longhouses currently in use at Crawford Lake often create a bottleneck when more than one school group is going through the

To keep the longhouses accessible, admittance is carefully monitored and there is currently a three month waiting list for school groups wishing a tour of the reconstructed Indian village.

"By the time the plan's fully implemented," Mr. Burchett says, "there'll be at least one longhouse available for public view at all

There are also plans for a new Visitor's Centre to complement the existing one. A new entrance road and parking area are in the plan, as are a few group campsites for those interested in an overnight program. The main entrance road will be rerouted around the village to increase foot traffic safety and a bus drop off point will be available.
