Town staff, the expert consultants retained in accordance with Council's direction and our solicitors.

As a result of the settlement, the Town has acquired approximately 300 acres of additional land resulting in the public ownership of natural, open green space lands from Norval to Cedar Park.


Council will present its position on the Halton Hills Village Homes Inc. and Silver Creek Estates subdivisions to the Ontario Municipal Board in the new year, however, this position is predicated on an OMB decision that an ade-


quate municipal water supply is available to accommodate this development. Halton Region's staff will continue its aggressive efforts to secure water for our community's growth.

For your information the population of Halton Hills, which includes the communities of Acton, Georgetown and the rural area, is expected to reach 65,000 by 2016. About 350 homes per year are being built in our community.
