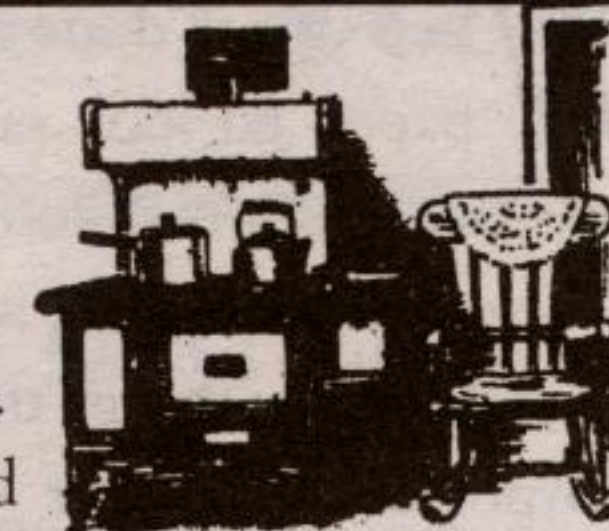

Keeping the home fires burning

Glenda's Kitchen Kapers

Well, this is a great way to start a new year - not meeting the December deadline for the paper. So, as I rush my mind goes blank. Sorry Reid! As you read this you will have enjoyed Christmas and your New Year celebrations. As I write this I am still finishing up the last minute baking for Christmas, wrapping presents and basically holding down the fort as Bert is recuperating from bruises and fractured ribs due to a little mishap with the roller. I don't think I ever want to experience the pain he is having. However, it's never so bad that it couldn't be worse (I keep reminding him as he suffers away). Because nothing spectacular comes to mind I will share a square recipe that I tried for the first time and really liked. I'm sure you'll be making squares for something in the new year.

CHEWY PEANUT BUTTER BARS

1 cup all purpose flour
1/3 cup white sugar
1/2 cup cold butter or margarine

FILLING:

2 eggs
1/2 cup corn syrup
1/2 cup white sugar
1/4 cup peanut butter
1/4 tsp salt
1 cup chopped peanuts
1/4 cup semi-sweet chocolate chips

In a bowl, combine flour and sugar; cut in the butter until crumbly. (I use my food processor). Press into a greased 13x9x2" pan. Bake at 350 for 14-16 minutes or until lightly browned. In a mixing bowl mix eggs, corn syrup, sugar, peanut butter and salt until smooth. Fold in peanuts and chocolate chips. Pour over crust. Return to the oven for 15-20 minutes or until golden brown.

CHEDDAR POTATO STRIPS

3 large potatoes cut into 1/2 inch strips
1/2 cup milk

1 tbsp butter or margarine
salt and pepper to taste
1/2 cup shredded cheddar cheese

1 tbsp minced fresh parsley
In greased 13x9x2" baking dish arrange potatoes in a single layer. Pour milk over the potatoes. Dot with butter; sprinkle with salt and pepper. Cover and bake at 425 for 30 minutes or until potatoes are tender. Sprinkle with cheese and parsley. Bake, uncovered for 5 minutes longer or until cheese is melted.

GARLIC MASHED POTATOES

Boil several potatoes with one or two garlic cloves (cut up). Drain well and mash well. Add milk, butter and a couple tbsp. of cheese. For a different flavour add 1 tsp. dried crushed rosemary instead of the cheese. One tsp. salt may be added but I usually prefer to let the salt be added at the table for those who wish to use it.

LEARN THE ABCS OF YOUR FIRE-EXTINGUISHERS

• **PULL** the pin • **AIM** low • **SQUEEZE** the handle
• **SWEEP** from side to side, keeping the extinguisher aimed at the base of the fire.
