

eing a volunteer for an Porganization such as 4-H Ontario certainly has its rewards and these usually come in the form of volunteer opportunities.


This past November, I was lucky enough to capitalize on one of those opportunities - the North Central Region Volunteer Forum in Des Moines, Iowa, USA.
