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## ATTENDANCE: 10 members, 1 guest, Ken Keates UPDATE ON MAINTENANCE - PUBLIC WASHROOMS, ETC.:

Marilyn met with J. Reynolds and D. Thompson to discuss maintenance issues. The Town will plant and maintain garden beds, provide regular maintenance for Campbellville banners, as well as mount the new Christmas decorations. All interested groups are asked to coordinate requests to the Town through Marilyn.

## Milton Council Briefs: April 2002

**CORTESE FARM PRODUCE:** Council approved a zoning amendment to permit an eating establishment in conjunction with a Retail Bakery on Crawford Crescent, Campbellville. The Town is working toward an agreement for the building to also include public washrooms, open weekdays during the summer months, and weekends throughout the year.

**GRANT APPLICATIONS:** The deadline for Round One of the Milton Community Fund applications is April 22 (Round Two closes on October 7). Forms and information are available through Community Services, [joy.ander-son@town.milton.on.ca](mailto:joy.ander-son@town.milton.on.ca).

**FIRST LINE NASSAGAWEYA RECONSTRUCTION:** Portions of this road, from Steeles to Campbellville Road, are scheduled for reconstruction this summer. A neighbourhood meeting last weekend explained the project to local residents. This matter will be coming to the Community Services Standing Committee on April 8. Call any Councillor or the Town for more information.

**NCCC:** The Nassagaweya Community Consultation Committee and the Milton Safety Committee received a Certificate of Recognition from the North Halton Cultural Awareness Council as part of the celebration of The

International Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination for their displays at last summer's Community Fair. Remember Roadside Cleanup Day, Saturday, April 27 and do your part! The next meeting of the NCCC is Monday, April 15 at the Nassagaweya Community Centre.

**HOUSE NUMBERING:** Council clarified the policy and by-law that requires every property be properly identified with the number clearly visible from the public road. This is particularly significant to assist emergency services in our rural areas. New construction must be numbered prior to occupancy. Owners must replace damaged or missing house numbers immediately. In rural areas, these numbers must be posted adjacent to the driveway at the property line.

**FIRE HALL:** Council approved the architect for the new Emergency Services facility in Campbellville. Construction will begin this summer.
