
FIRST LINE NASSAGAWEYA RECONSTRUCTION: Portions of this road, from Steeles to Campbellville Road, are scheduled for reconstruction this summer. A neighbourhood meeting last weekend explained the project to local residents. This matter will be coming to the Community Services Standing Committee on April 8. Call any Councillor or the Town for more information.

NCCC: The Nassagaweya Community Consultation Committee and the Milton Safety Committee received a Certificate of Recognition from the North Halton Cultural Awareness Council as part of the celebration of The
