Public Washrooms

Public washrooms in the new plaza are a go. There will be a sign. Washrooms will be open during the hours of the village (10 a.m. - 5 p.m.).

Street Signs

The Town of Milton is planning new street signage for Campbellville next year. There is room for a logo below the street name.

Community Services Fund Application

Marilyn has prepared an application to the Community Services Fund for the TODS sign and web site for Campbellville. Design of a logo for Campbellville is to be included as part of application for promotion of village. Mark is to get an estimate for the logo design work. The logo will be used on the proposed web site, street signs and promotional material.

Promotion

KOA Campgrounds proposed merchant discount for campers. Marilyn has given membership list of CABA to the owner of KOA so that he can follow up with merchants.

Patti Was will be looking after promotion. Any members who are interested in helping out are welcome. Possible activities could include model boat racing on the pond. Customized shopping bags for the village were discussed. Cheapest method is to prepare a large rubber stamp. Paper bags range in size (cheapest is \$0.48 per bag). Stamps are \$11.00 ea.

Prominent closed signs on adjacent stores are creating a problem for merchants who are open. Posting your hours as an alternative would be greatly appreciated.

Safety for Seniors

Starts next week in Campbellville. Volunteers will be visiting interested businesses to

assess the safety of their premises and give recommendations for improvements. Participating stores will receive a Stepping Out Safely decal to display in their window. 18 businesses are interested so far.

Fire Hall Update

The fire hall will be coming up before the Town Council for approval. Tenders have already been let for the design.

Smoking ByLaw

Region of Halton requested that MIlton develop by-law to address the issue of smoke in the workplace. An extensive consultation process has been carried out and a by-law prepared to reflect public input. Once passed, Milton will become 100 per cent smoke-free in restaurants, bars and public places with some exemptions. Charity bingo halls will have to provide non-smoking rooms.

Separate air handling systems for these areas are to be installed by January 2004. At the Mohawk Raceway, smoking will be permitted in the gaming areas only while eating areas and bars will be 100 per cent smoke free. In private clubs, only members will be allowed to smoke.

New business to open in hamlet

Campbellville is getting a larger these days with a new place to eat, buy baked goods and use a public washroom.

Mario Cortese of Cortese Farm Products was recently given the green light by Milton Town Council which amended the zoning bylaw to allow for a new 28-seat eating establishment and retail bakery.

While the Region of Halton indicated concern throughout the bylaw altercation process over the projected sewage flow from the building exceeding those identified as appropriate through hydrogeological studies for the area, those concerns were laid to rest when the Cortese's voluntarily withdrew their plans to use the two buildings west of the small mall for residen-

tial use and signed an amending agreement to cooperate with any Region conditions regarding maintenance, monitoring and reporting of the sewage flow.

The new buildings are also part of an agreement with the Town of Milton to provide much needed public washrooms for the busy hamlet of Campbellville.

Along with picking up chips and dips, shoppers will also be able to stock up on alcohol at the new LCBO outlet opening next month at Cristello's Village Market.


Owners Tony and Marlene Cristello couldn't be happier about their new expansion.
