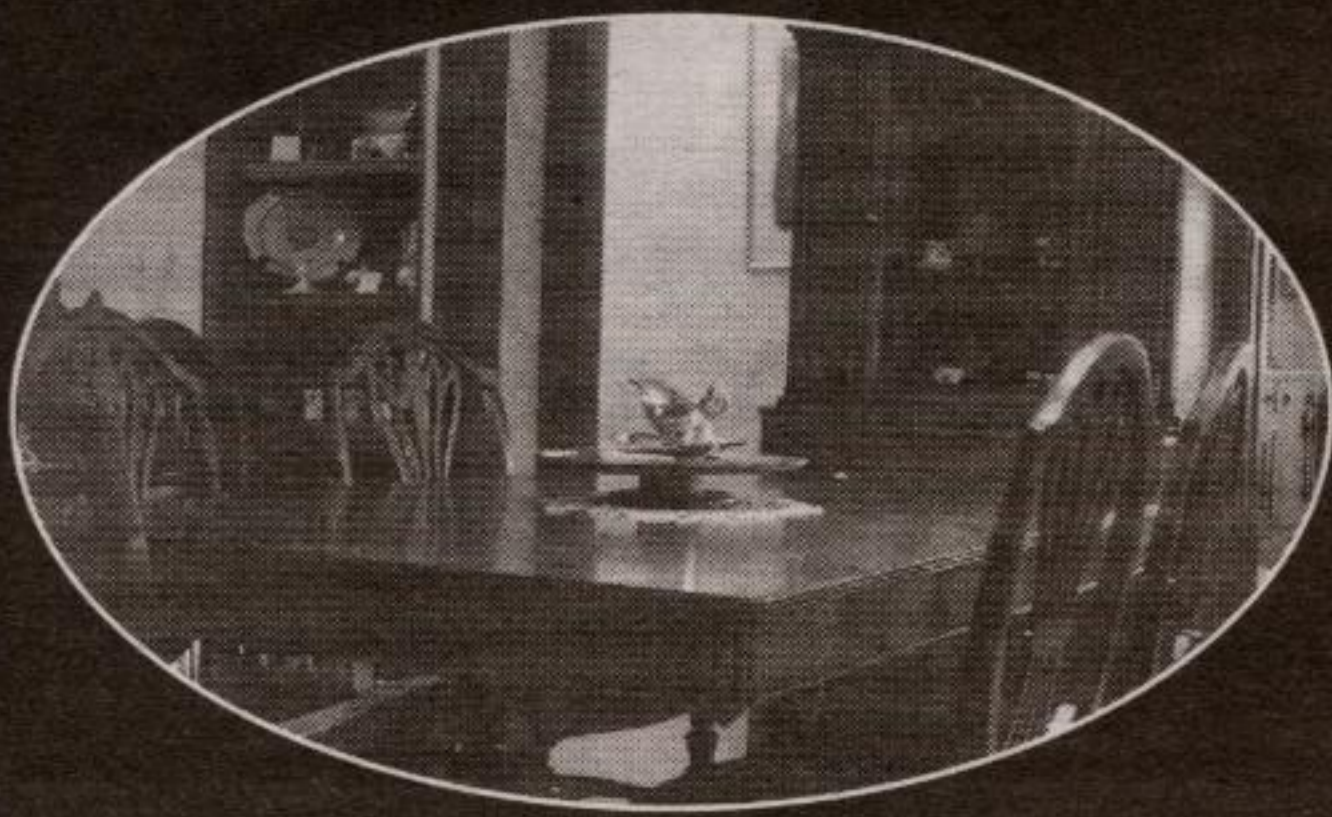


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CAMPBELLVILLE COUNTRY NEWS

REVIEW MINUTES OF MARCH 13, 2002

Street Signs: If a logo is desired, a design should be submitted to Lisa Candervliet to accompany the sign proposal.

Public Washrooms: Public washrooms are set to open when the new bakery opens. Temporary port-o-lets will be removed at that time.

Community Services Fund Application: Marilyn has submitted application and additional information requested by the Committee. A decision has not been made.

ANDREW SILTALA, TOWN OF MILTON'S ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT OFFICER:

Andrew Siltala discussed his role with the Town of Milton. Reporting to the CAO, Andrew works on trying to encourage new businesses to come to Milton. His three objectives are to

attract new business

(in particular, industrial businesses), retain existing business, and provide information on economic development issues to council. Milton is endeavoring to keep taxes low by increasing the square footage of commercial/indus-

trial space by attracting new businesses. The council has sent a strong direction that growth should not be funded on the backs of the existing tax payers but should pay its own way.

Andrew often helps businesses experiencing problems with red tape and is always willing to share his expertise. The Town of Milton web site will be redesigned in the next few months and Andrew will ensure that Campbellville has more representation on the new site.

A link to the proposed Campbellville web site, as well as a better map would help. The focus of the web page will be to advertise the services that the Town provides and give access to such information as open tenders. A Campbellville web site with a link to the Milton web site would be the most effective way of increasing exposure.

FIRE HALL UPDATE

Designs for the new Fire Hall were on display this evening. While the design could be more artistic, it is a good start to improve the interchange area. Police, fire and ambulance services will be accommodated in the new building. The plan is to break ground in July.

The design features a safe haven room with an emergency telephone, two fire bays with space for additional equipment, a 24 hour ambulance service station, a tower for hose drying and repelling practice and training, and a shared training area. Sirens will not be used unless absolutely necessary. Staff will be rotated to ensure that staff get to know the area.

CAMPBELLVILLE BIRTHDAY CELEBRATIONS - June 22, 23

NEW BYLAW FOR SIGNAGE

The Town of Milton will be reviewing a draft proposal for a new sign bylaw. The present bylaw is enforced on a complaint basis. Permanent signs are required to be on your property and of a certain size.

NEW BUSINESS

John Was proposed that CABA meetings alternate with the new bistro once it opens. Everyone agreed that some variety would be welcome.

TODDS Sign: Randy Nichol has suggested that a streetscape would be very effective. Rick and Kathy will take photos of the village for consideration. A new catch phrase has been developed: "Campbellville: Experience the Village". Rick liked this and recommended that we keep it simple ie. Slogan and Exit No. 312.

GO Transit: New riders survey results have been released. Of the 546 riders surveyed, 60 per cent of riders come from Milton. Breakdown was as follows: 60 per cent Milton; 12 per cent Cambridge; 7 per cent Kitchener; 7 per cent Wellington; 5.5 per cent Halton Hills; 5 per cent Guelph and 3.5 per cent Waterloo.
