

Here's what's happening in June.

The underground work has now been completed. New curbing and new paving the length of Main Street in Downtown Milton has now been done. Now we're in the final phase-pouring of sidewalks, decorative brickwork, new lamp standards and finally new trees and landscaping. By the end of June, we'll be down to the 'finishing touches'. Watch for a grand re-opening in early July.

What about new landscaping?

Unfortunately, the old trees' roots were intertwined in the underground pipes that had to be replaced. Many shrubs were saved and are being replanted in Campbellville's downtown. Downtown Milton will have new trees! 42 new trees -- locusts, maple, crabapple, cherry, pear, tree lilac and lindens + over 600 perennials, 28 shrubs and hanging baskets on the new street lights.
