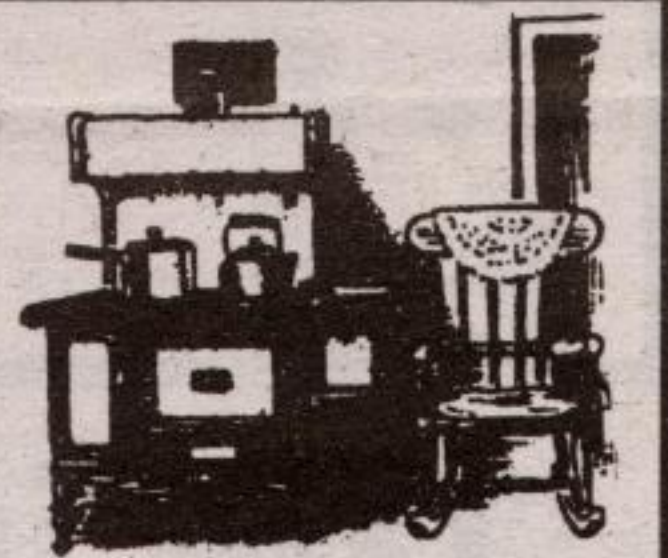

# Glenda's Kitchen Kapers

Now that summer is here we all turn to making more salads and easy to prepare meals.

*This fruit salad dessert is always a hit!*



### FRUIT SALAD DESSERT

- 1/2 pineapple fresh or small canned chunks
- fresh cherries
- 1/2 melon
- 1/2 honeydew melon
- fresh green grapes
- small container cool whip
- nutmeg to taste
- 2 or 3 tbsp. salad dressing (Miracle Whip)

Any other fresh fruit may be used. Arrange fruit platter in bite size pieces. Combine cool whip, salad dressing and nutmeg in a bowl. Mix completely. Place bowl with the dip in centre of fruit platter. Provide fondue forks for dinner-guests. Allow them to choose and dip their own dessert. A very good light dessert for summer or winter.

### FROZEN COCKTAIL SALAD

- 1 small can drained cocktail (I use a 14 oz. can)
- 1 small can drained pineapple (I use a 19 oz. can tidbits)
- 8 oz. pkg. Philadelphia cream cheese
- 1/2 cup salad dressing
- 1/4 cup white sugar
- 1 cup small marshmallows (cut in two)
- 1 small can carnation milk
- 2 tbsp. lemon juice
- 2-3 drops of green food colouring

Blend Philadelphia cheese with salad dressing. Add sugar and marshmallows. Separately, beat carnation milk until it stands in peaks. Add lemon juice and food colouring. Mix all together and freeze. Will soon soften for a meal.

### DILLED CUCUMBERS

- 1 large cucumber, thinly sliced
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 1/8 teaspoon
- 2 teaspoons chopped fresh dill or 1 tsp dill weed
- 1/2 cup sour cream

Place cucumber slices in a medium bowl. Sprinkle with salt and pepper. Stir in dill and sour cream. Chill until ready to serve.
