## BROOKVILLE OPERATIONS YARD FALL CLEAN-UP WEEK MONDAY, SEPT. 23rd TO SATURDAY, SEPT. 28th, 2002

A week-long Fall Clean-up is being offered for the first time at the Brookville Operations Yard on Guelph Line to provide rural residents of Milton the opportunity to dispose of large household items. Bins will be placed in the Yard and staff can direct where items are to be placed.

Items that will not be accepted for disposal are:

- Hazardous waste including: chemicals, paints, solvents and waste oil
- Tires
- Propane Tanks

Residents needing to dispose of these types of items are directed to go to the Halton Region Landfill Site located on Regional Road #25 south of Britannia Road.

The hours of operation for the Brookville Yard are 7:00 am to 3:00 pm, Monday to Friday, and 8:00 am to 4:00 pm on Saturday. The Yard is closed on Sundays.

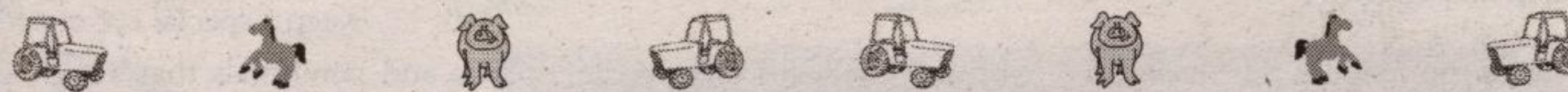

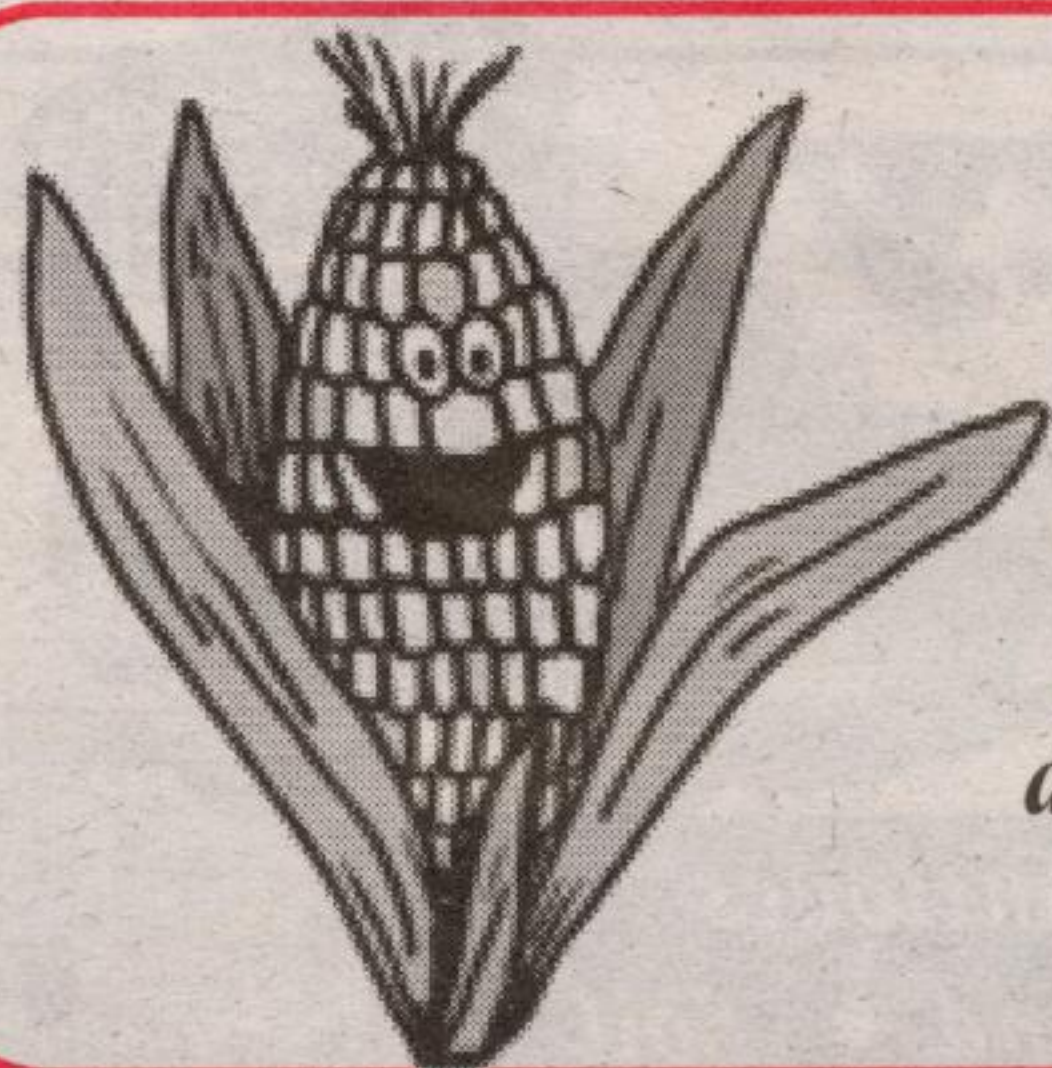
