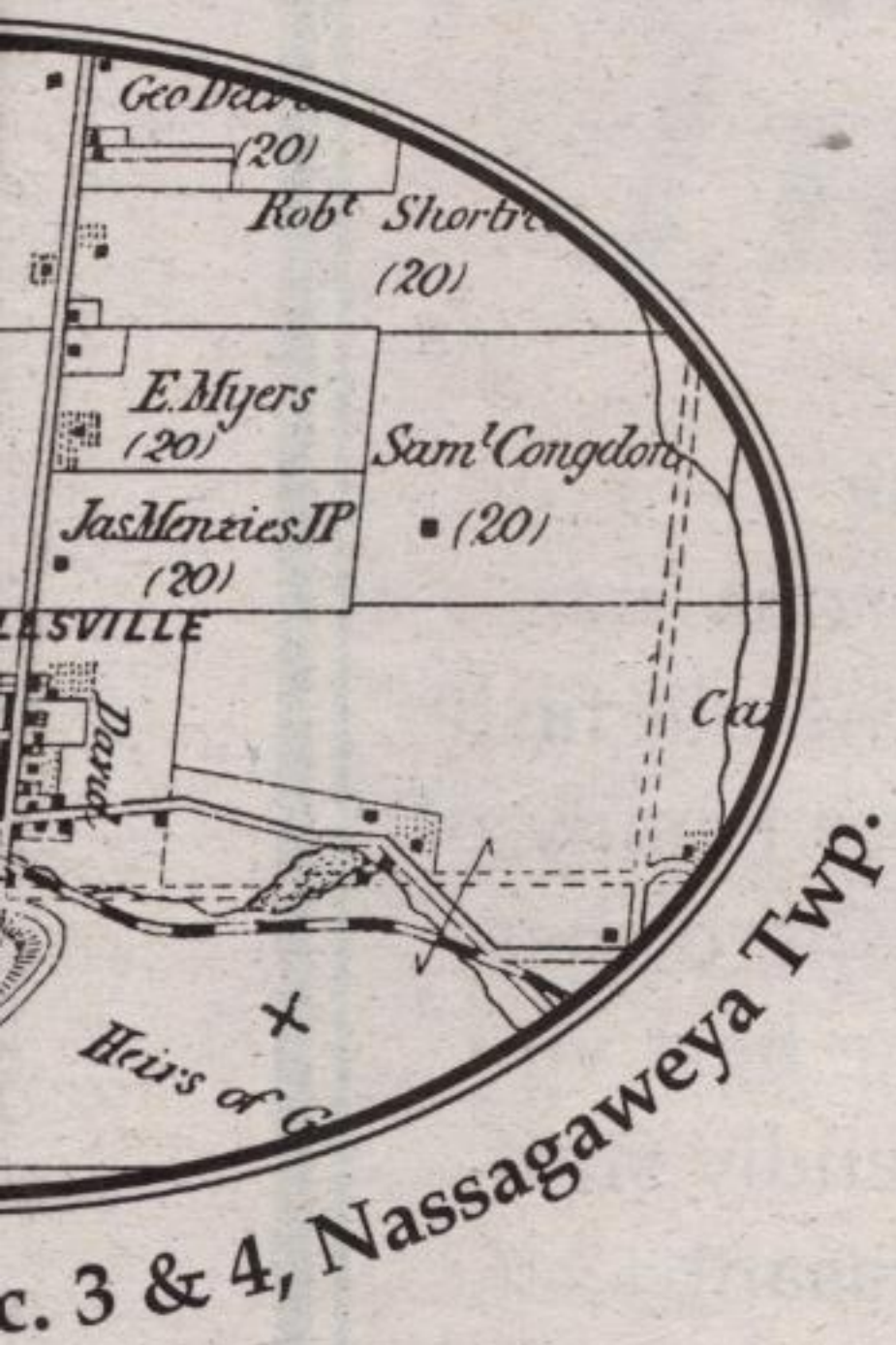
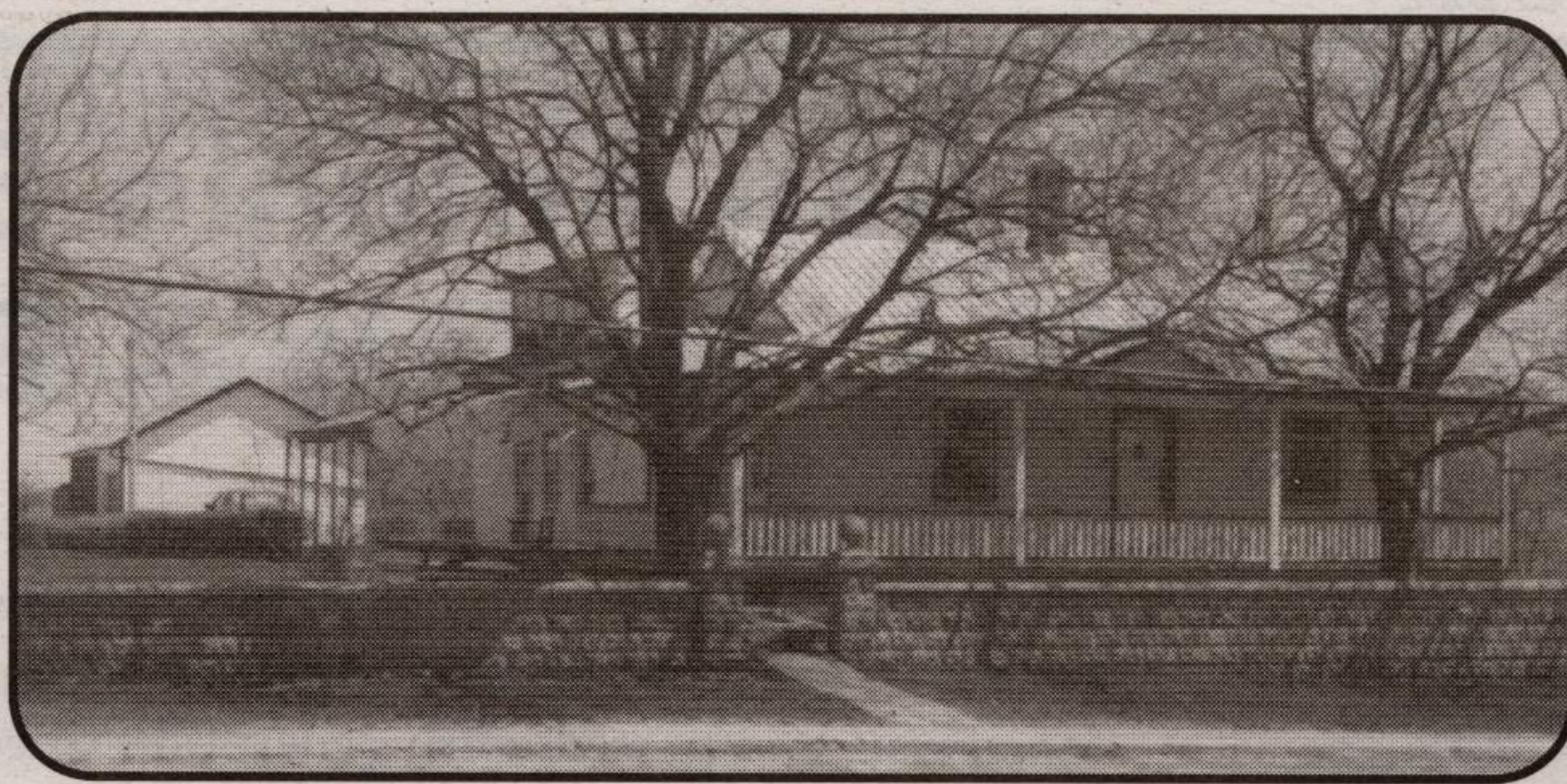


# Memories

would ship to Chicago from California and the chauffeur would drive it to Campbellville. He gave land for S.S. #10. At David's death Frank A. and his wife Teresa Duffy moved into the dilapidated house, which has been remodeled many times. Frank, one of the first village trustees, was a kind gentleman with a congenital hip problem that limited his physical activities. Teresa Duffy, known as Aunt Tess, was a strong, dynamic woman, a grand housekeeper, cook, and seamstress who liked nice things - especially hats. Being a party lover, Tess wanted a big 70th birthday party, thinking it might be her last. Surprisingly she had 29 more parties and was alert and active, dying in her 100th year. Frank and Teresa had two children, Esther and John D.

Esther was a sweet, devout, kind, unassuming person, who saw the best in everyone. She married Frank Quillan, a very fine man who was manager of the Campbellville branch of the Bank of Nova Scotia for many years. They had one daughter, Mary Teresa. Born in St. Thomas, John D. came to Campbellville to live at two-and-a-half years of age after Uncle David died. John's father Frank was born in the cottage next door over 140 years ago. John D., known as Jack, had a quick Irish temperament and strong convictions. He liked powerful cars, and was proud of the village and his ancestors. He was also an unknown benefactor to many less fortunate. Jack married Doris Switzer and they had five children: Mary Helen, Frank, Margaret, Anne, and John. The Jack Wheelihan family is the fourth generation to live in the old homestead. In 1985, 38 acres of the west half and 50 acres of the east half were sold for a development. The family retained approximately three acres, the main house, cottage, and barn. Mrs. Jack Wheelihan is still a very prominent and active resident in the village of Campbellville.
