CABA signage setback

hat seems to a matter of taking one step forward and two steps back, has resulted in another setback for the Campbellville Business Area Association's (CABA) quest for a TODDS sign on Highway 401.

Responsibility for all highway signage is in the hands of the TODDS Company and CABA has been working with them for months on signage that would let travellers on the 401 know that Campbellville is a tourist attraction offering unique stores, restaurants and more.

CABA's first hurdle came in raising the necessary funding for the sign, when their application to the Milton Community Fund, the portion of the slots revenue that is allocated to community groups, was declined.

Instead, CABA was referred by the Community Services Advisory Committee to Town of Milton staff for funding ideas, as this signage would require yearly maintenance.

The Town approved funding through the Gateway Signage Program and everything seemed to be falling into place for the business association.

"I started to think to myself that things were going too well," says Ms. Marilyn Goodale, a spokesperson for CABA. "Something just didn't feel right." Ms. Goodale had contacted Mr. Randy Nichols at the TODDS office throughout the whole process and was elated when she was able to inform him that funding was now in place for the sign.

TODDS representatives and already been out to Campbellville to approve sites for the signs, and all that seemed left was finalizing the details. Instead of setting up a time to install the signs, Ms. Goodale was was shocked to be told that CABA did not, after all, qualify for the signage it had been working on for months.

"I just found out from Randy Nichols that apparently you can't have two area profile signs, and since

Escarpment Country already has signs, our local business association is disqualified."

Ms. Goodale is mystified why Mr. Nichols and the TODDS office seemed so receptive to the signage up to the point that it was to become a reality, before stating it couldn't be done.

CABA is still seeking ways for the signage to be installed, and will apply to Tourism Ontario for special permission to put the signs in the area of Highway 401, along with the Escarpment Country signage. Despite the mounting frustration of the situation, Ms. Goodale remains optimistic that the provincial government will support their application.

"It's not over yet," states the CABA executive member. "I would have thought he (Mr. Nichols) would know what he's doing. CABA members believed we were finally going to get the thing in the works and then they come and pull the plug. It's very frustrating and disappointing."



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




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
