While York Region is building amphibian tunnels for the nationally threatened Jefferson salamander, (Toronto Star, Sept.17/02), Halton Region voted in June to allow zoning for a new quarry license application that would see the bisection of the Niagara Escarpment Plan area and destruction of the habitat of the Jefferson salamander.

In 1962, Dufferin Aggregates quarried through the face of the Niagara Escarpment right where everyone could see the destruction from the #401 at Milton. This PR blunder is often sited as the catalyst that brought together other concerns which eventually led to special legislation attempting to protect the Escarpment and the subsequent zoning plan that went with it.

Now this United Nations Biosphere Reserve is under increasing threat from proposals that ignore all the rules. While everyone has been focusing on the Oak Ridges Moraine the Niagara Escarpment is being removed truck load by truck load. Please tell the Ontario government that you appalled.
