

## COUNCIL NOTES by Cindy Lunau

**SPECIAL DAYS** - October 14-20 is Canada's Citizenship Week. Oct 17-19 Milton District Scouting holds their annual Apple Days. October 21-27, the Recycling Council of Ontario sponsors Waste Reduction Week. October 25-November 9, the Royal Canadian Legion conducts their annual Poppy Campaign.

**REMEMBRANCE DAY** - Two days are set aside to honour those who have served our country. The Royal Canadian Legion Parade & Service will be held at the Haltonville Cenotaph (15 Sideroad & Guelph Line) on Sunday, November 3rd, and at Victoria Park on Sunday, November 10th. Roads leading to these sites will be temporarily closed beginning at 1:30 p.m.

**ZONING AMENDMENT APPLICATIONS** - Public Meetings were held for Zoning Amendments which would permit additional residential lots in two areas of Nassagaweya. The Planning Department will prepare a Technical Report for each application including public comments and evaluations by related Agencies. Council will then consider & vote on the Amendments. If you wish to add your comments, please contact Barbara Koopmans at Town Hall. Applications are as follows:

- 1) Three additional lots at the eastern edge of the Moffat Hamlet (15 Sideroad & Second Line Nassagaweya.)
- 2) Sixteen additional lots off Amos Drive, west of the Guelph Line in Brookville.

**STOKECREST SUBDIVISION** - Council approved a Zoning Amendment and Draft Plan Approval to this subdivision on the west edge of the Village of Campbellville. Additional environmental work will be completed to insure that all proposed well & septic systems are adequate and will not impact neighbouring properties. The number of proposed lots has been reduced from 34 to 31 lots and the historic farm home will be preserved. In an unusual approach, four zoning areas are identified within the subdivision & field monuments within the property will explain the function of each of the different zones.

**COUNCIL COMPENSATION** - Council received a report including recommendations initially proposed by a Citizens Review Committee. The bottom line - effective January 2003, the Mayor's salary will be \$44,340 (from \$41,385) and Councillors will receive \$19,039 (from \$13,905). This compensation will be in the 60th (from 49th) percentile of comparative municipalities in accordance with the Corporate Policy Manual for all Town employees.

### NOTICE

By-law No. 70-95, as amended, regulates the licensing and control of the keeping of dogs and animals other than dogs within the Town of Milton.

**TAKE NOTICE THAT:**

- Every owner of a dog shall, within seven (7) days of ownership, cause each dog to be licensed and registered with the Clerk's Office. The owner shall keep the tag securely fixed on the dog at all times;
- Every cat owner shall place on the cat a collar on which is permanently inscribed the name and address of the owner;
- No person shall keep more than two (2) dogs in the Urban area; three (3) dogs in the Rural area;
- No person shall keep more than three (3) cats in the Urban area; five (5) cats in the Rural Area (unless in barns and other agricultural buildings);
- No animal owner shall permit his or her animal to be at large on any public place;
- No animal owner shall permit his or her animal to be at large on any private property without the consent of the property owner. Note: An animal shall be deemed to be running at large if found in any place other than the premises of the owner and not under the control of any person;
- **The owners of dogs and cats shall be responsible for the removal and sanitary disposal of any excrement of the animal from any private or public lands and failing to do so is guilty of an offence.**

All residents are requested to adhere to the requirements of By-law No. 70-95.

**DOG TAGS ARE YOUR PET'S PROTECTION.** By licensing and ensuring that the tag remains on the dog at all times, increases the chances of having your pet returned home. **Please note there is a 'Lifetime' License fee for dogs with microchip.**

This is a notice, pursuant to Subsection 210(146)(e)(f) of the Municipal Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter M.45 as amended, of the Council meeting at which the proposed Sign By-law is to be discussed and considered for adoption.

The purpose and effect of the proposed Sign By-law is to:

- Repeal existing Sign By-law 18-82 and amending By-laws 33-91 and 74-93, being By-Laws to regulate the erection, location, class and type of signs and/or advertising devices in the Town of Milton and replace the by-laws with a New Sign By-law to meet the needs of the Town, the sign industry, Milton businesses and the general public.

The purpose of this meeting is:

- to inform Town Council, landowners, area residents, and interested individuals about the proposed Sign By-law;
- to provide an opportunity for interested individuals to ask questions and express their views regarding the proposed by-law, Town Council shall hear any person, who, prior to the Council meeting indicated in the notice, contacts the Office of the Town Clerk at (905) 878-7211 and applies to be heard prior to 4:30 p.m. October 23, 2002.

If you are unable to attend the meeting, signed written submissions will be accepted by the Town Clerk prior to the meeting. Such written submissions will become part of the public record.
