Glenda's Kitchen Kapers

So how was the Pumpkin Pie with potatoes? To the ten ladies who called and all the other readers, of course, it was a typo error but you know it wasn't a bad error. To the typist, don't feel badly because another name for that pie is Impossible Pie and believe it or not it is not impossible to make the pie with potatoes. I did it just for fun and shared it with 5 of my friends. I much prefer it with pumpkin but the spices spruced up the potatoes and it was hard to tell that potatoes were there. Even Bert thought it was quite edible. Here is the original Impossible Pie recipe.

IMPOSSIBLE PIE

4 eggs
2 cups milk
¼ cup butter
½ cup white sugar
1 tsp vanilla
½ cup Bisquick OR ½ cup flour
1 cup coconut
Blend first six ingredients at low speed for 3 minutes. Pour into greased pie plate. Stand for 5 minutes. Sprinkle coconut on top. Bake 40 minutes at 350°F.
I like to sprinkle nutmeg on top before baking.

Yams or sweet potatoes are considered a Thanksgiving dish but I use them many times throughout the year. Here is a tasty version.

SWEET POTATO SPECIAL

½ cup flour
½ cup brown sugar
¼ cup butter
¼ tsp allspice
3 lbs sweet potatoes (cut into ¼ inch slices)
1/3 cup pecan halves
½ cup maple syrup
In a bowl combine flour, sugar, and allspice. Mix well and cut in butter until crumbly. Place half the potatoes into a 2 quart casserole and cover with half the crumb mixture. Add the rest of the potatoes and cover with the rest of the crumb mixture. Top with pecan halves and drizzle maple syrup over the top. Cover with foil and bake at 350°F for 40 minutes. Uncover and bake for 10 minutes more. May be

used as a vegetable dish or for dessert.

This is my family's favorite cabbage recipe.

SKILLET CABBAGE

¼ cup butter
6 cups coarsely shredded cabbage
¼ cup chopped onion
½ tsp salt
¼ tsp nutmeg
2 tbs vinegar
2 tsp granulated sugar
In large skillet melt butter; add cabbage and onion. Season with salt and nutmeg. Mix well. Cook covered, over low heat, stirring frequently for 15 minutes or until tender but firm. Combine vinegar and sugar and add to cabbage and toss. Cook another 5 minutes.

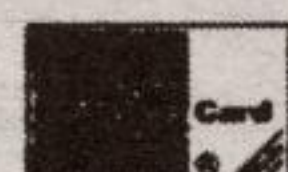
