### Hillcrest addition dedicated

A open a 2500 square foot addition to Hillcrest United Church, located at Trafalgar Road and Five Sideroad in Halton Hills, was held on November 3.

While the stimulus for the \$400,000 project was a growing church school, the addition also provides new offices, a spacious foyer, a large classroom/meeting room and two smaller meeting rooms.

Safety and accessibility were two other major considerations for the building project. As a result, the existing building was renovated to include a handicap lift, a wheelchair accessible washroom, and an improved staircase leading to the main level of the church, as well as to the lower level auditorium.

Chair of Hillcrest Church Council Marjorie Hryciw says, "This addition will allow us to better serve both our own congregation and the community around us. We have an excellent interactive Sunday school curriculum that is very popular with the children but had outgrown our existing facilities. Our church is used by a large number of local community groups and we had reached the

point where we could not handle all the requests for meeting space."

Scouts, Guides, Tai Chi, Ashgrove Women's Institute, 4-H and a large number of farm organizations use the church facilities on a regular basis.

The addition was designed by architect Doris Cheung and built by ABCO Construction, starting last

June, and completed at the end of September.

"Thanks to a grant from the Ontario Trillium Foundation toward the renovation portion of the project, combined with the support of the congregation, we have been able to meet our expenses without a mortgage," comments Ken McNabb, Chair of the Building Committee.
