

The final barrier was ceremoniously removed from Eden Mills Community Hall on November 12 in an event to mark the completion of the accessibility project.

After five years of volunteer planning, labour and raising \$160,000 in donations, the community will reap the grand results of allowing all four levels of the hall to be open to individuals with mobility restrictions.

"We planned on a renovation grant, but hadn't planned on a restoration grant as well," noted Chris Wilson, President of the Eden Mills Community Club. "This, today is a chance to say thank you . . . and to let you see what your generosity has begat."
