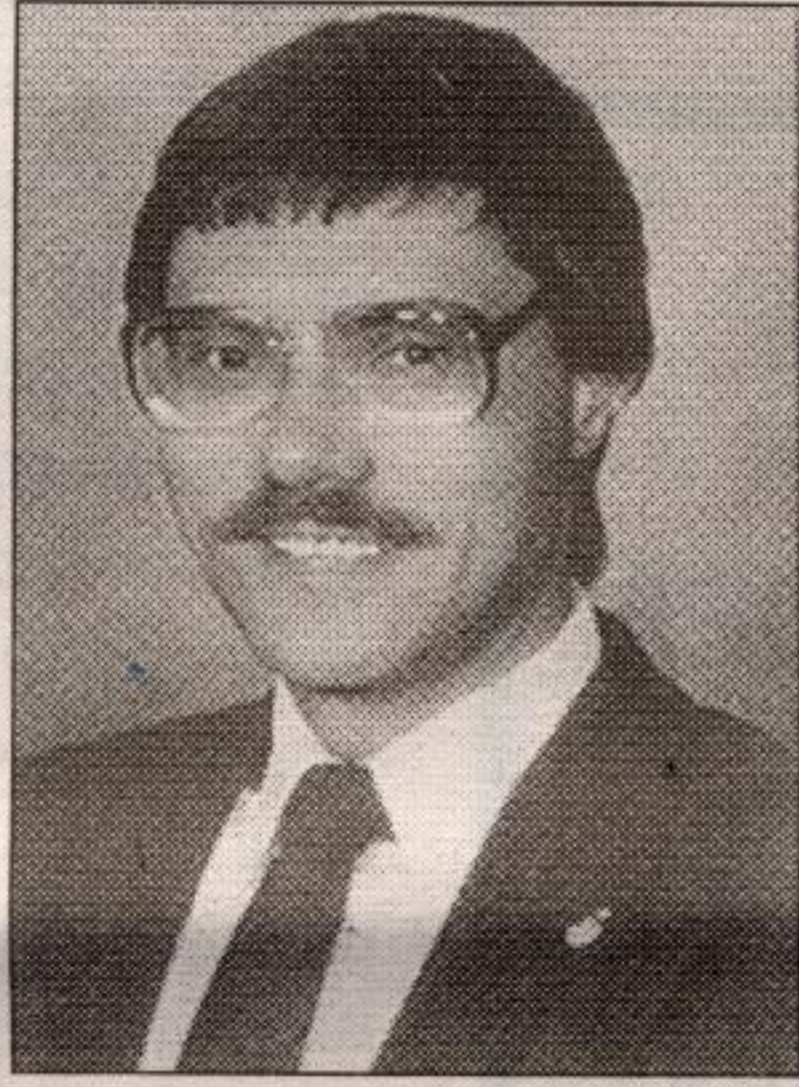
After 12 years of representing Milton's Ward 4 at the local level, Town Councillor Ron Furik has set his sights a little higher for the next municipal election. On May 23, he announced his candidacy for Regional Council, Wards 2 and 4.

"We have lost vision on a regional basis," explains Mr. Furik. "There are many regional and local issues which are priorities to Miltonians that must be dealt with. Brown Water, water quality, traffic issues surrounding CN's inter-modal plans, policing and regional roads, to name just a few."

On the local level, he plans to support a new Arts and Cultural Centre, work towards providing Milton's seniors with affordable

housing, and support local business to ensure the survival of Milton's downtown core.

An active member of his community, Mr. Furik is well known to Miltonians through his volunteer commitments with the Milton District Hospital Foundation, the Milton District Kinsmen, the Milton Library Board, the Milton Tennis Club and the United Way. He has also participated in many organizations in which his five children have been involved. When not working as a real estate sales representative for



ReMax, Furik has served as the Town's representative on the

Budget Committee, the Chamber of Commerce, the Community Services Advisory Committee and the Downtown Business Association.

"I believe that to get things done, you need to be a leader," says Mr. Furik. "You must have vision, have the trust of the people you represent at the Region and be an effective team player. I believe in my community and in strong people working together for a strong and vibrant community. I believe it's time for a change."

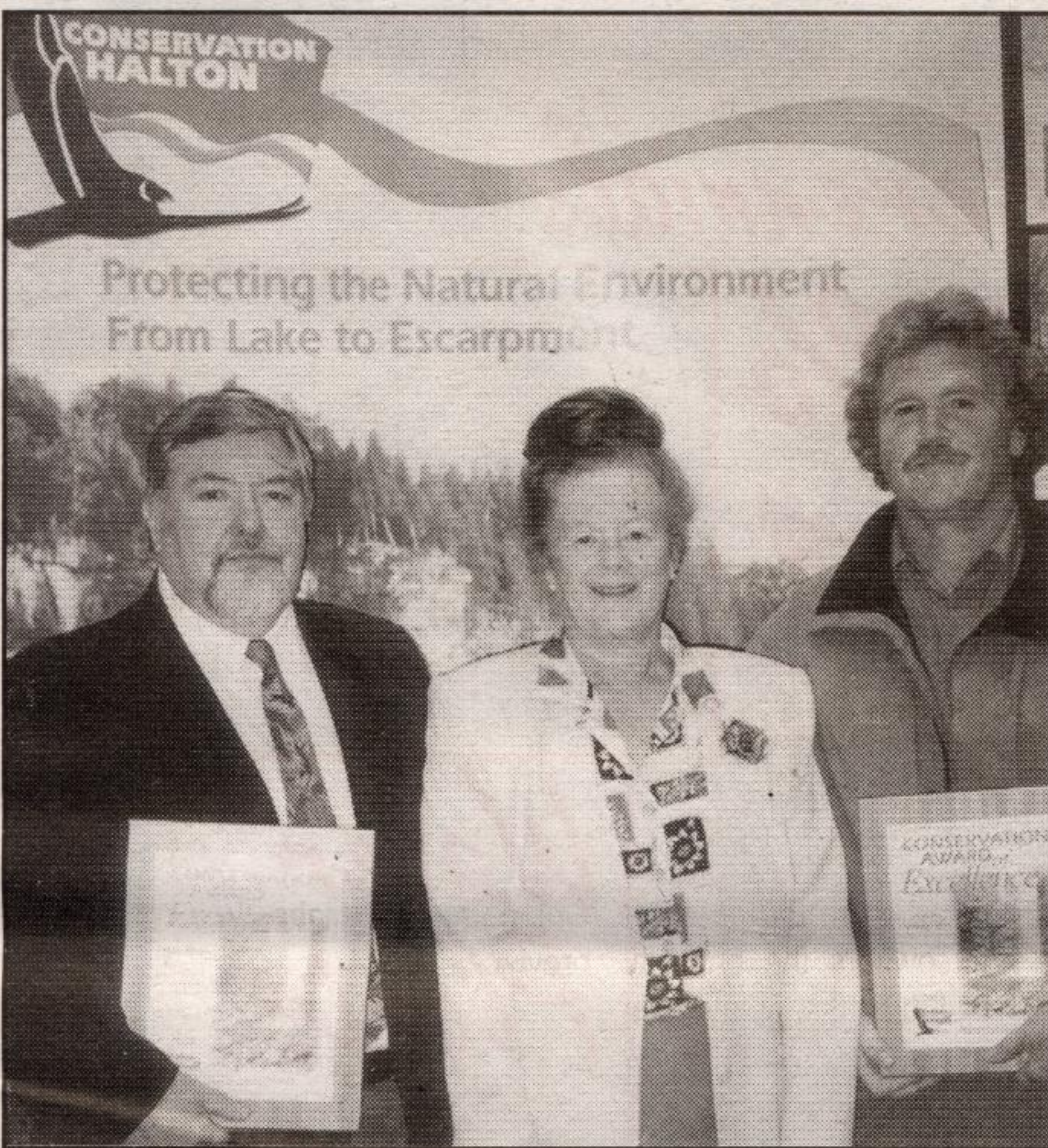

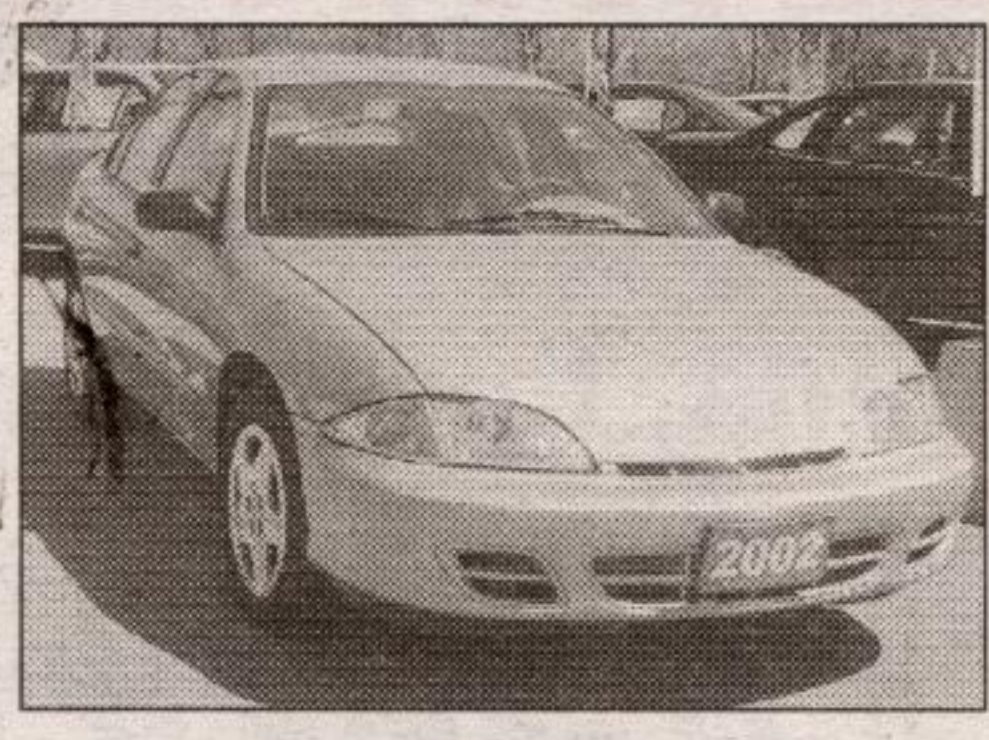

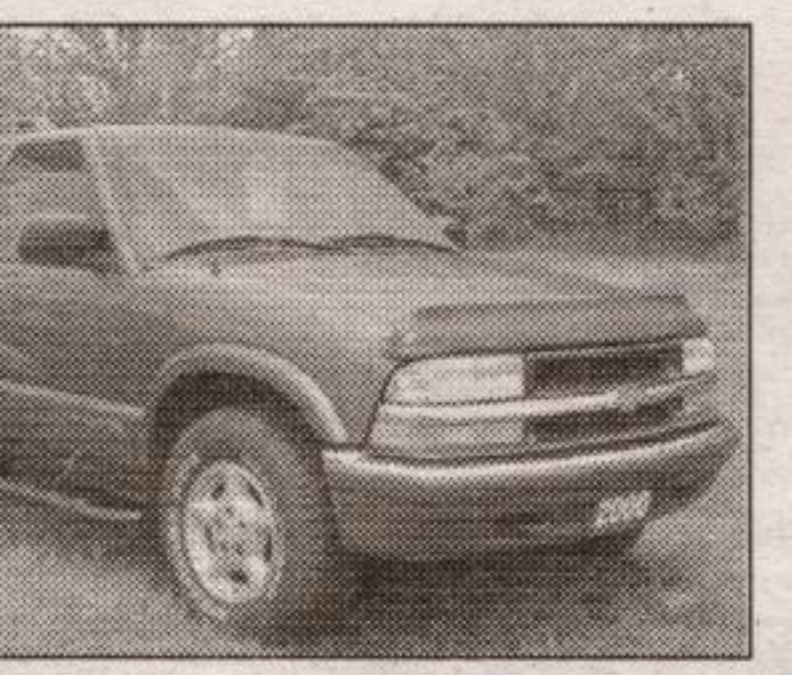
